Routines and daily structure (key points)

• School starts at 8:30 (register at 8:55). Tasks are prepared for children to engage with between 8:30 and 8:55.

 Snacks are allowed to be brought in for a break time. Toys and personal belongings are not allowed.

 If your child is having a packed lunch, we recommend and encourage a healthy balance.

Avoid glass and single use plastic water bottles.

Organisation for September

Extended arrival between 8.30am – 8.55am remains

Pupils can arrive at school between 8.30am and 8.55am and go directly into class. Families will continue to follow the usual one way system for drop off.

Year Group Break and Lunchtimes

Pupils will continue to have staggered break and lunchtimes within their year groups. This provides more space to play. Children have a defined lunchtime sitting where they arrive and leave altogether.

Collection

Lessons will finish at 3.15pm. Children who walk home from school will be dismissed at 3.10pm. We continue to operate our queuing and one way system.

• Regularly used in Y4, children are encouraged to check the Google Classroom as often as they can.

 Pupils are already enrolled and able to sign in, parents are to be invited to join via an email link soon.

Homework (Brain Builder homework posted here).

Important updates and weekly learning schedules posted here also.

Brain Builders (homework)

To start this week.

Used to support learning and strengthen key skills and concepts.

Posted and handed in on the Google Classroom.

 Posted every Friday (with the weekly schedule) and handed in the following Thursday.

Spellings and spelling books

- Purple book to use at home to practise spellings. Children are to write down each of the weekly words to the end of the line.
- Optional extension task to write what each word means.

 Books are due to be handed in every <u>Monday</u> where they will be checked. Books will be handed out again with new spelling words each Tuesday.

Spelling quiz takes place every Monday after books have been handed in.

 Daily spelling session in place to support the development of spelling and vocabulary.

Home Link Books

 Children record their reading in their Home Link Book (they can record their reading of their chosen book from the class library box or a book from home).

Parents and children must read and sign the first pages of the book together.

 Record reading 3 times each week (minimum) and ensure each week has been signed by parent/carer. Number of pages read and book title must be noted each time a child reads at home.

 Home Link Books can be used to communicate messages between parents are teachers (use the notes page each week).

Times Tables

 Huge push in Y4 (especially with TTRS) - statutory assessment at the end of the year (June).

 As we go through the school year, teachers will be sending information home regarding your child's progress and the statutory assessment.

 Children are expected to know multiplication facts up to 12x12 by the end of Y4 (speed, automaticity, accuracy are essential).

 Weekly times tables lessons in school (efforts outside of school are vital for success).

<u>Uniform</u>

All children should wear appropriate uniform at Woodcroft Primary School.

The uniform for all pupils consists of:

- A red sweatshirt (either plain or school logo versions)
- A plain white shirt or polo shirt
- Grey trousers (boys & girls) or a grey skirt (not black)
- Black shoes must be worn. All other footwear; including trainers (except for PE days), boots, open toed sandals are not suitable for school and should not be worn.
- All head coverings should be in school colours red, white, grey or black.
- Red gingham school dresses can also be worn.

Uniform (P.E)

A FULL PE uniform should include



- Plain white t-shirt
- Plain navy shorts
- · Trainers that are below the ankle

No high top trainers or plimsolls



- Plain navy blue jumper (no hoodies/zips)
- Plain navy blue joggers

No hoodies or zips (for safety) and please avoid branded items

P.E and Swimming (TBC)

 P.E every Wednesday (and on a Friday every other half-term).
