In 2012 we built the Butterfly Garden in the KS2 playground. It was in memory of a Woodcroft teacher, Julie Thomas, who died suddenly on holiday during that summer. We also buried a time capsule filled with items and work from each class of that year. Pupils at the time decided it should remain buried for 10 years.

It is now time to open the capsule! We have had to delay this event twice, first due to the 40C temperatures that we experienced before the summer, and again earlier this term because of the death of Queen Elizabeth II.

In assembly, pupils have learned about the history behind the time capsule and watched a video of its excavation. On Monday, the capsule will finally be opened - we are all excited to see what has survived inside!




The Birthday Book Club

I am sure you will join us all in wishing the happy couple all the best for the future.




Punctuality is important!

Punctuality for school is essential! If a child arrives late it not only disrupts their learning, but also that of the whole class. Lessons start promptly at 9.00am, and if a child misses the introduction to a session it can have an impact for the whole lesson.

Can we remind all parents that **school opens at 8.30am***

(*8.00am for Breakfast Club)

Children are able to go directly to class at 8.30am where class teachers are waiting to receive them. Teachers then take the register at 8.55am and we then aim to make a prompt start to learning by 9.00am. We do understand that there will be rare occasions when children are late to school due to unforeseen circumstances. But lost minutes can equal lost learning. Just 5 minutes per day can add up to missing the equivalent of 3 days of school each year!

After School Care Provision at Woodcroft

We are now offering places in our after school club for Woodcroft pupils. Parents are able to register their child, and then book them into the club for either a $\frac{1}{2}$ session at a cost £6.00 per child, or a full session at a cost of £9.00 per child.

A snack will be included in the price. Please note, the school does not make a profit from Acorns.

Collection is from the main entrance of the school at the two specified times of 4:30pm and 5:45pm.

If you are interested in your child attending Acorns After School Club they will need to be added to this term's register. To do this, please contact the school by telephone, or e-mail. If you have any questions then call the office and ask to speak with Mrs Hurley, your Acorns Co-ordinator, and we will gladly give you any further information required.

As before, your child will be collected from class at the end of the day by one of our Acorns staff. Children will still get involved in a variety of activities, including sports, art and crafts and games. Your child will learn new skills whilst enjoying themselves, in a safe and secure environment.

What next:

- 1. If you are interested in your child attending Acorns After-School Club please register by calling the school office and speaking with **Mrs Hurley**, your Acorns Co-ordinator.
- 2. Once registered you will be able to book sessions in advance.
- 3. The charges are as follows:
 - 3:15 4:30pm = £6.00 ½ Session (1 hour 15 min) until 4.30pm

3:15 – 5:45pm = £9.00 Full session (2 ½ Hours) until 5.45pm

- 4. If you arrive after the allocated time you will be charged a £2.00 late collection fee.
- 5. Refreshments are included in the price.

Safe Driving and Parking Around School



We continue to receive complaints from both neighbours and parents about inconsiderate drivers who park on pavements, across driveways and in other potentially dangerous places. Please think about others when you are dropping Road Safety children off at school.

Consider these do's and don'ts...

Do

- Do park a short distance away from the school and walk the rest of the way. This is both safer and healthier for you and your child
- Do park safely and walk your child through the school gates

Don't

- Don't park across driveways
- Don't mount the curb and park on pavements think about younger children and buggies
- Don't park across junctions and on street corners
- Don't stop on the yellow zig-zag lines in Goldbeaters Grove to let children out at the front of school or reverse into people's drives
- Don't use the car park driveway in Wolsey Grove at the back of school

We have had a number of near miss incidents caused by cars. There was also a recent accident involving a child at a nearby school who was seriously injured when a car mounted the pavement.
