

Teachers Strike Day #2 - Thursday 2nd March

The main teachers union, The NEU, voted to take industrial action in London for 4 days this term on 1^{st} February and then the 2^{nd} , 15^{th} , and 16^{th} March.

We have again assessed the likely impact of the strike at Woodcroft and are notifying parents and carers that **school**

will be closed to pupils on Thursday 2nd March

We understand that the decision to close will be disruptive. You will also be aware that different schools are affected in different ways. This is due to a range of factors such as the number of teachers in different unions and how they collectively respond. It must be made clear that this dispute is not with the school or its families but the government. If you have any queries, please speak with Mr Tallon or Mr Russell and not with other staff members.

What will happen on Thursday?

Children should stay at home with parents and carers making arrangements for their care during the day. School will open as normal again on Friday.

Will my child be given work to do?

Teachers that are striking can not set work on Wednesday. Non striking teachers should not cover their duties. So, at Woodcroft we have decided to issue some **special activities linked to World Book Day**. This will be set next week in addition to the regular Brain Builder Homework. Teachers will explain it to children at the start of the week. This means there is a consistent approach across the school and can be completed in place of lessons at home on Thursday.

Will food be provided?

Families will again be invited, with their parents, to a family lunchtime on Thursday between 12.00 and 1.00pm. Our kitchen will be serving a hot meal to enjoy in our dining hall. So we can get an idea of numbers, a Google Form will be emailed to families today (Friday) to indicate whether they will be joining us. The normal meal rate will be charged including those who are eligible for a free



M&M Theatre Perform 'The Secret garden' on Monday 27th February





World Book Day Vouchers coming out next week!




World Book Day vouchers will be distributed next week.

Welcome to ... The Reading Rainbow Curriculum at Woodcroft



The Reading Rainbow helps children develop rich language and knowledge about books. It is now what we use to teach comprehension at Woodcroft.

When we read a book we can choose one of the rainbow lenses to focus our thinking. A lens gives us a specific way of looking at the text. There are twenty-seven lenses in the Reading Rainbow, and each one enables us to ask questions to deepen our understanding of a book.

Experienced readers will automatically use all of the lenses as they need them. However, when children are learning to read they will need to practise by using one lens at a time.

Each lens is an important piece of the reading comprehension puzzle. However, the more we practise, the more automatic their use becomes, and the better our reading skills will be.

We also use The Writing Rainbow. This has been a feature of our English lessons in KS1 and KS since September. You can find out more about both of these exciting programmes on our website at ...


We currently have cases of head lice in School. This is very common and easily sorted out, but only if we all take responsibility and check our children's hair.

Please follow the simple steps outlined below:

Step 1	Comb in any type of hair conditioner on dry hair. This stuns the lice and makes it difficult for them to grip the hair or run around.
Step 2	Now comb sections of the hair with a fine tooth head lice comb.
Step 3	Wipe the conditioner from the comb onto a paper towel or tissue.
Step 4	Look on the tissue and on the comb for lice and eggs.
Step 5	Repeat the combing for every part of the head at least 4 or 5 times.

You can also visit your doctor or chemist to obtain prescribed treatments.

We also recommend that you get a special comb that is designed for the job
