UK Government says <u>NO</u> to Mobile Phones for Children

ALL schools must prohibit the use of phones in school. It has issued new guidance:

There is increasing evidence that phones damage developing brains, raise the likelihood of childhood mental illness and open the door to inappropriate content.

Mobile Phones

- Any phones seen during the school day will be confiscated and a parent will need to attend the office to collect the device.
- Parents / Carers please ensure that the office has the most up to date numbers - so that we are able to contact you in an emergency.

Spelling Homework

- We use a spelling scheme called Sounds-Write.
- This uses a combination of phonics and syllables to help children learn to spell
- The children will be given 12 words a week and will be asked to learn their spellings using these new strategies
