



Woodcroft is going Smartphone Free after Easter



We want your child to be healthy, safe and successful at school. We believe that for primary age children a smartphone has the potential to do significant harm. As a result, the Governing Body of Woodcroft has decided to make our school smart phone free. This means pupils will not be allowed to bring a smartphone to

school after the Easter break.

All smartphones found in school will be confiscated and only returned to an adult

If older children absolutely need a phone when travelling independently to and from school then they will be allowed to bring a traditional feature phone that allows calls and texts only.

Barnet Food Waste Policy



Barnet has implemented a new food waste policy. We must now separate ALL food waste from our general rubbish and recycling. Take a look at the poster to see examples of what can and can not be included.

The following practices are to be introduced into school in order to deal with food waste.

Packed Lunches

In the dining room we will ONLY accept food waste from packed lunches. All general rubbish must be brought home in lunch boxes. The following can be disposed of in school.


- Uneaten food

Household Support Fund - No Easter Food Vouchers



We have been notified by Barnet that they are not issuing Food Vouchers for the Easter Holiday. This scheme is not run by the school, we only distribute the vouchers we receive to eligible families.

Is your child a young carer?



If your child is, or you think they may be a young carer, then they are not on their own. Barnet has over 6,500 young carers. We know that all young carers are different and have different challenges and play different roles within their families/households. What we do know, is that with the right support, most young carers can thrive and live the lives they want to. And that is where we come in.

Our programmes provide great activities for young carers of all ages during the school holidays and some really special opportunities. We can also help them if they are struggling at school. Our education support barnet young carers includes free tutoring in all subjects and can really help them get back on

track if their caring role has had an impact on their school work. We also have a mentoring programme which gives them the opportunity to have a skilled and experienced mentor many of whom have been young carers themselves - to talk to them about their experiences. This can be delivered during the school day or online at a convenient time.

We also run group mentoring sessions (led by our professional mentors) within their school day, where they can meet with other young carers in their school and support each other in all aspects of their day, inside and out of school.
