A Parent Guide To Woodcroft Annual Reports and Pupil Assessments

Ahead of the distribution of reports next week please take a moment to understand how teachers arrive at their judgements and what they mean. Below is a short guide to codes we use in school.

Woodcroft uses a progress tracking system that is matched to our curriculum. Every term, teachers carry out a range of 'Depth of Learning' assessments for each subject in the National Curriculum. You may hear older children at Woodcroft talk about 'POP Tasks'. These are 'Proof Of Progress' assessments that enable teachers to record where children are in relation to age related curriculum expectation.

- o BB Below Basic the pupil requires support to access the curriculum
- o B Basic (Remembering) the pupil can recall the curriculum information
- A Advancing (Knowing) the pupil knows how to solve problems and explain ideas and concepts
- D Deep (Reasoning) the pupil knows how to creatively apply and connect their knowledge in more complex ways

Please note, to achieve 'Basic' in Year 6 is significantly more difficult than in Year 1. Assessments are linked to the National Curriculum expectations for that year group. Therefore, if a child achieves a 'Basic' judgement every year then they are making good progress and are on track to pass their SATs in Year 6.

There are also additional National Curriculum Assessments (SATs) in Year 6, Multiplication Tests in Y4, Phonics Checks in Y1 and Y2 and Baseline Assessments in Reception. Year groups in KS2 (Y3 to Y6) also carry out standardised assessments in Maths and English twice per year.

Previously, we included these depth of learning judgments on our reports. However, parents said they did not understand the terms. We then decided to return to our original categories. Teachers simply match these up with their Depth of Learning assessments.

Emerging = Below Basic (pupil still requires some support)

Expected = Basic (the pupil can understand and recall core curriculum information)

Exceeding = Advancing (the pupils can solve unfamiliar problems and fully explain their ideas)

 \star = Deep (we add a star in the Advancing column if a child is demonstrating 'Deep' attainment)

As you can see, if your child is making expected progress, then they are at or above a Basic level and are therefore on track to pass SATs in Year 6.

Events

Classes will rotate around a series of activity-bases scoring points for their team. Parents can follow their child/children around the circuit. We ask that families stand back to allow school staff to organise their pupils without distraction.

- 1. Tug of War
- 2. Long Jump

- 5. Egg and Spoon Race
- 6. Bean Bag Put

Scoring 1st place = 5 points 2nd place = 3 points 3rd place 1 point.



Sprint Finals

After the events, we will have a **Sprint Final**. The fastest pupil from each team will have a class final. The winner from each class will compete in a race-off in a key stage final.

Dismissal of KS1

After the KS1 and Early Years sports day, parents and carers will take their children directly home from the sports centre. Class teachers will dismiss pupils at the end of the event.

Suitable sun hats in school and for sports day

As the weather improves, we recommend that children wear hats at break times as part of their sun-safe behaviour. However, can we remind parents that caps should be appropriate for school. That means they should be plain and without bold logos. We do not allow graffiti-style caps or the latest 'Snapback' or sports designs. These are expensive fashion items and have caused problems in the past. Hats should ideally follow our school uniform code and be red, grey, black, blue or white.

Woodcroft Is a WATER ONLY School



By choosing water, this means children are not drinking sugary drinks which contribute to many preventable health conditions like obesity, tooth decay and type 2 diabetes.

Please only fill your child's bottle with water - juice is not allowed.

Personal 'PLASTIC' Refillable Water Bottles

As we encourage the regular drinking of water throughout the day it is important to have a sensible, reusable plastic bottle.




- 1. Every child should have a named reusable water bottle.
- 2. Bottles should be brought to school **filled** with fresh water **every day**. Personal water bottles are taken home every day to be washed.
- 3. We do not allow single-use disposable bottles in school.
- 4. We do not recommend metal bottles as they become dented, unstable and make a noise when knocked over in class. Please also avoid oversized bottles (e.g. the latest Stanley versions) as they take up too much table space!
