The Benefits of Reading Aloud Together at Home

Whatever the age of your child, Nursery to Year 6, reading aloud together improves accuracy and fluency Why read aloud? Research shows that reading aloud with your child is <u>the</u> number one thing you can do to help prepare them for future success. In fact at Woodcroft we could say, read aloud 'together for success'!



Pupil Premium Funding: Do you qualify?

School budgets have been significantly cut in recent years. Did you know that we are also partly funded through the Government's Pupil Premium Grant. Schools receive an extra £1345 for every pupil who is eligible so it is vital that the school knows who qualifies.

We cannot claim this extra funding unless we register all eligible families. Unfortunately, we are NOT told who qualifies – we rely on parents informing the school.

You are eligible for Pupil Premium if you receive any of the following:

- ➤ Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400
- > Income Support

- ➤ Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- > Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- > The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- > Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- > Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190

In these times of drastic cuts to school budgets it is essential that Woodcroft receives the maximum funding. Please speak with our Office staff if you think you may qualify.

Government uniform guidance: What parents need to know




The government has published <u>statutory guidance</u> aimed at making school uniforms more "affordable". The Education Secretary said "school uniform provides a sense of identity and community for children and young people, and should be a real source of pride, but it must be affordable for families."

Parents at Woodcroft will be reassured to know that we currently meet all of the criteria set by the Government regarding school uniforms. We do this by:

- Regularly reviewing our uniform policy
- · Keeping branded items 'to a minimum'
- Selling items at the cheapest price to parents.

Year Group Friday Extra PE Day

Classes do an extra unit of PE for part of each term. This enables teachers to cover the gymnastics and dance elements of the curriculum. Parents and carers will be notified when their child's class is taking part in one of the extra units. The extra units are only for half of the term with the rest of the term focusing on Spanish in KS2 (Y3 to Y6) and additional reading in KS1 (Y1 and Y2)

Note: Year 3 will be receiving their additional session on a Monday (and NOT Friday) this term. Their PE will be taught by our resident choreographer, Miss Williams.

Make Sure Your Child Is Prepared For School in KS2 (Y3 - Y6)

Classroom Kit for Year 3 to Year 6

We recommend children in KS2 have their own pencil case with essential equipment. This should be a simple, one pocket zipper case (nothing complicated!). It should only contain school essentials.

Pencil case essentials



- Eraser
- Ruler
- Basic colouring pens/pencils
- Handwriting Pen (blue) (not biro)

Optional extras for KS2

- Glue Stick
- Protractor (angle measure)
- Highlighter (single)



Pupils in KS1 (Y1 and Y2) and EYFS do not require any additional equipment and should not bring pencil cases to school.

Refillable Water Bottles Only: Always remember your refillable PLASTIC water bottle. We do not allow disposable single use bottles in school. Metal bottles are also discouraged (they dent, become unbalanced, and disturb learning when they frequently fall on the floor)

Year 6

Year 6 pupils should only bring a clear plastic pencil case to school. This is to ensure that all pupils are fully compliant with the testing arrangements for their KS2 SATs.

After School Care Provision at Woodcroft

We are now offering places in our after school club for Woodcroft pupils. Parents are able to register their child, and then book them into the club for either a $\frac{1}{2}$ session at a cost £6.50 per child, or a full session at a cost of £10.00 per child.

A snack will be included in the price. Please note, the school does not make a profit from Acorns.

Collection is from the Oak Suite Gate by calling the Acorns After School Club number.

If you are interested in your child attending Acorns After School Club they will need to be added to the register. To do this, please contact the school by telephone, or e-mail. If you have any questions then call the office and we will gladly give you any further information required.

Children are picked up from class at the end of the day by one of our Acorns staff. Children will still get involved in a variety of activities and learn new skills whilst enjoying themselves, in a safe and secure environment.

What next:

- 1. If you are interested in your child attending Acorns After-School Club please register by calling the school office.
- 2. Once registered you will be able to book sessions in advance via the Arbor App.
- 3. The charges are as follows:
 - 3:15 4:30pm = £6.50 ½ Session (1 hour 15 min) until 4.30pm
 - 3:15 6.00pm = £10.00 Full session (2 hours 45 mins) until 6.00pm
- 4. If you arrive after the allocated time you will be charged a £2.00 late collection fee.
- 5. Light refreshments are included in the price.

*Reception pupils are only accepted once they are settled in to school






Woodcroft promotes a Smartphone Free Childhood

Adults - please support our initiative

We are politely asking ALL adults; parents, carers and staff not to use their phones when on school premises. This means on the playground at pick up and drop off times. Please finish your calls at the gate and do not

use a phone in school. We believe this sets a good example for all of our young people and keeps Woodcroft Smartphone Free.





All pupil smartphones found in school will be confiscated and only returned to an adult.

If older children absolutely need a phone when travelling independently to and from school then they will be allowed to bring a traditional feature phone that allows calls and texts only.
