Behaviour comes first!

 We use positive behaviour techniques and routines to encourage your child to accomplish excellent behaviour to allow everyone to feel comfortable and able to learn.

• In Year 1 we use dojo's (personal points), team points, stickers, yellow cards, star of the week.

At Woodcroft, we use 1, 2, 3 magic! to teach behaviour.

 There may be green or blue cards for children not following the behaviour expectations.



- You will receive 2 books each week.
- Read aloud every night for approx 10-15 minutes.
- Encourage your child to use their phonics knowledge to decode the text.
- Home Link Book (Please make sure these are signed and kept in bookbags)
- Ask questions to improve your child's understanding of the text.

The Benefits of Reading Aloud Together at Home

Whatever the age of your child, Nursery to Year 6, reading aloud together improves accuracy and fluency Why read aloud? Research shows that reading aloud with your child is the number one thing you can do to help prepare them for future success. In fact at Woodcroft we could say, read aloud 'together for success'!



Phonics

In Year 1 children will move on from the initial code onto the extended code. The scheme we use is Sounds-Write.

We will begin to learn the alternative spellings and pronunciations for

different sounds eg:

Rain, came, day, acorn

Be mindful not to contribute to misconceptions of schwas. Eg. m, t, r.

Extra support?

As we move through the year, we may determine pupils require additional support.

We arrange this by running small support group interventions (reading and writing).



Phonics Screening Check

The **phonics screening** check is a statutory assessment that all year 1 children across the country take part in. This usually happens in June.

It is to confirm whether individual children have learnt **phonic** decoding to an appropriate standard.

It will identify the children who need extra help so they are given support by their school to improve their reading skills.






2. Username and password - see your class teacher about this. Class teachers can reset and address any issues.



- Focus on the basics!




What do your children not need?
