• If your child is having a packed lunch, we recommend and encourage a healthy balanced one.



Healthy Snacks for Break Time in KS2 (Y3 to Y6)

We encourage pupils to lead healthy lifestyles. Children in EYFS & KS1 are provided with snacks in school every day. But a healthy snack for breaktime is a great choice for pupils in Y3,4,5 and 6. If you wish to send your child with a snack please make sure it is wrapped or boxed.

Suggested snacks:

- Sliced fruit
- Cheese sticks
- Cut veggies
- Raisins
- Cereal bar (check the sugar)
- Small sandwich or crackers





Make Sure Your Child Is Prepared For School in KS2 (Y3 - Y6)

Classroom Kit for Year 3 to Year 6

We recommend children in KS2 have their own pencil case with essential equipment. This should be a simple, one pocket zipper case (nothing complicated!). It should only contain school essentials.

Pencil case essentials

- Pencil and sharpener
- Eraser
- Ruler
- Basic colouring pens/pencils
- Handwriting Pen (blue) (not biro)

Optional extras for KS2

- Glue Stick
- Protractor (angle measure)
- Highlighter (single)

Pupils in KS1 (Y1 and Y2) and EYFS do not require any additional equipment and should not bring pencil cases to school.

Refillable Water Bottles Only: Always remember your refillable PLASTIC water bottle. We do not allow disposable single use bottles in school. Metal bottles are also discouraged.

How can I support my child's learning?

- Ensure homework tasks are completed and returned on time
- Times Tables and essential number bonds are practised Mathsframe
- Spelling learn and complete sheets
- Daily reading please hear your child read as often as possible, record and sign in Home Link books
- Encourage neat handwriting and presentation
- Practise typing and digital skills



The Google Classroom

*

 Regularly used in Y4, children are encouraged to check the Google Classroom as often as they can. Important updates and weekly learning timetables posted here also.

 Pupils are already enrolled and able to sign in. Pupils must sign into the school website with their login details to access the Google Classroom. Log in details can be found in their Home Link books

Parents are to be invited to join via an email link soon.

Spellings and spelling books



 Purple book to use at home to practise spellings. Children are to complete the sheet given to them.

 Books handed in every Monday where they will be checked. Books will be handed out again with new spelling words each Friday.

Spelling quiz takes place every Monday after books have been handed in.

 Spelling sessions included in the weekly timetable to support the development of spelling and vocabulary for that week's spelling list.



Brain Builders (homework)

Used to support in class learning and strengthen key skills and concepts.

Posted on the Google Classroom and returned copies to the teacher.

Shared every Friday and handed in the following Thursday.

Home Link Books

+

• Children record their reading in their Home Link Book (they can record their reading of their chosen book from the class library box or a book from home).

Parents and children must read and sign the first pages of the book together.

 Record reading 3 times each week (minimum) and ensure each week has been signed by parent/carer. Number of pages read and book title must be noted each time a child reads at home. Home Link Books will be checked and returned back to pupils every Wednesday.

 Home Link Books can be used to communicate messages between parents and teachers (use the notes page each week).



The Benefits of Reading Aloud Together at Home

Whatever the age of your child, Nursery to Year 6, reading aloud together improves accuracy and fluency Why read aloud? Research shows that reading aloud with your child is the number one thing you can do to help prepare them for future success. In fact at Woodcroft we could say, read aloud 'together for success'!



Times Tables

*

 Huge push in Y4 (especially with <u>TTRS</u>) - statutory assessment at the end of the year (June).

 As we go through the school year, teachers will be sending information home regarding your child's progress and the statutory assessment.



 Children are expected to know multiplication facts up to 12x12 by the end of Y4 (speed & accuracy are essential).

 Weekly times tables lessons in school (efforts outside of school are vital for success).

Here is how it works:


- 1. Children give a book to their class library.
