Our first TTRS comp of the year!




Stunning 1st Place for Woodcroft!




Packed Lunches at Woodcroft

All children at Woodcroft are provided with a FREE school lunch. However, for a variety of reasons, a small number of parents choose to send children to school with a packed lunch from home.

The Food Standards Agency survey of packed lunchboxes showed that many children's lunchboxes contained too much sugar, salt and fat and little fruit and vegetables. The school is committed to encouraging parents to provide healthier lunchboxes for children at Woodcroft Primary School.

The school actively discourages some packed lunch foods. A list of foods considered to be in this category includes the following: Sweets & Confectionary, Chocolate Bars, and Added-Sugar and/or Sweetened Drinks. Fizzy Drinks are not allowed in school, on grounds of health and safety.



The school recognises that parents provide packed lunches for a variety of reasons, including dietary requirements or intolerance, and religious observance. For this reason, no food may be swapped or shared from packed lunches. Food swapped or shared may be confiscated.

Woodcroft is a nut free school. Food provided in packed lunches should not contain nut products as this can seriously affect the health of other pupils. Grapes should be cut up lengthways for younger pupils.

Food not eaten in a packed lunch will be taken home by the child to ensure that parents know what their child has or has not eaten. We will encourage parents to include in lunchboxes those foods which are known to have a positive impact on the child's physical development and ability to concentrate and thus learn effectively.

Lunchtime staff will engage with children and chat to them about what they are eating.

Healthy Snacks for Break Time in KS2 (Y3 to Y6)

We encourage pupils to lead healthy lifestyles. Children in EYFS & KS1 are provided with snacks in school every day. But a healthy snack for breaktime is a great choice for pupils in Y3,4,5 and 6. If you wish to send your child with a snack please make sure it is wrapped or boxed.

Children should only bring 1 small snack, ideally from the suggestion list below:

- Sliced fruit & cut veggies
- Cheese sticks
- Plain rice cakes
- One small sandwich
- Crackers/Breadsticks

Important Notes: We <u>avoid</u> chocolate (high sugar) and crisps (high fat and high salt) so please do not include them as snacks for breaks. Also, we do <u>not allow</u> any nut products in school due to allergies.

EYFS, Y1 and Y2

Pupils in EYFS, Y1 and Y2 are given healthy snacks in school so are not required to bring any from home.

Dietary Safeguarding Procedures

Our catering provider, ISS, is dedicated to ensuring that pupils can enjoy nutritious lunches which are served safely in healthy environments. They have strict dietary safety procedures. These are outlined in the documents below (click on the links to download) or ask for a copy from the office.




