Party Clothes

Party Food

Class teachers will inform parents and carers of the arrangements for party food in your child's class. In school we have a number of important things to consider. These include allergies, or have religious or vegetarian diets.

All party food should follow the same guidance this is our **Party food safety checklist**:

- Only provide items that DO NOT contain nuts Woodcroft is a **NUT FREE** school
- No chocolate or chocolate products e.g. chocolate cakes and spreads
- No fizzy drinks
- Please, only supply pre-packed cakes and biscuits that come with ingredient lists (*So that means* <u>no</u> **home baked cakes** even though they are the best!)
- Avoid cakes or savoury items that require cutting in school staff do not have time!

We want parties to be fun and safe for everyone, so we thank you for your understanding and support on these matters. Take a look at the detailed partyfood guidance later in this issue.

PARTY FOOD GUIDANCE

At the end of term pupils will be celebrating with their annual Festive Class Parties. This is a time for some festive fun and games. Food is an important part of any celebration, and families traditionally send in a plate of food for sharing. **We would like this tradition to continue at Woodcroft**. However, in school we have a number of important things to consider. These include children with allergies, vegetarian and religious diets, safe food preparation, government healthy eating guidance and the school food policy. *If only life was simple!* We do have a number of pupils with **severe nut allergies** currently in school, so we have to take these considerations <u>very seriously</u>.

Please note: If you DO NOT wish your child to participate in the food aspect of a class party please let your class teacher know with a message in the Homelink Book. We recommend that parents who withdraw their child from sharing food at parties send in a separately labelled lunch box with party food items for their child. These individual party box items must still follow the checklist below:

Party food checklist:

- Only provide items that DO NOT contain nuts Woodcroft is a NUT FREE school
- No chocolate sweets / bars
- No fizzy drinks
- Fruit juices should ideally not contain added sugar
- Only supply pre-packed cakes and biscuits that come with ingredient lists (*So that means <u>no home baked cakes even though they are the best!*)</u>
- Please avoid cakes or items that require cutting in school

Suggested party food:

- ❖ Sausage rolls or veggie sausage rolls
- Sausages / veggie sausages
- Samosas / spring rolls (vegetable is best then everyone can share)
- Pizza slices
- Sandwiches (various fillings) no nut or chocolate spreads please
- Crisps and Popcorn
- Salad items cherry tomatoes / mini cucumbers / carrot sticks
- ♦ Small fruit (satsumas, small bananas, washed cut grapes, etc)
- Non chocolate biscuits or individual cakes (in packaging with an ingredients label)

We understand the difficulties; however schools have got to consider the well-being of every individual. Thank you for your understanding and support on this matter.

Reminder about Birthday Bags and Treats: Please do not send in cakes & sweets for birthdays

Because of severe food allergies and individual dietary requirements we need to closely monitor all food in school. Unfortunately, this poses a problem when birthday treats are brought in – often late in the day! We

therefore **DO NOT accept sweets and cakes as birthday treats**. We realise that this can be frustrating, however please understand that teachers are responsible for the health of all of the 30 children in their class!

For this reason we promote our **Birthday Book Club** scheme and suggest a book instead of sweets.

Reminder: Children can come to school in party clothes on the day of their party. A suitable coat and footwear for break time and lunch are essential!
