Christmas message from our Chair of Governors



As we come to the end of the autumn term I want to reflect on just how much has been achieved across our school community this year. Woodcroft's ethos, "Together Towards Success", is not a slogan; it is evident in classrooms, corridors, performances, trips and daily interactions.

Academically, pupils and staff have delivered exceptional outcomes. Our Key Stage 2 SATs were our strongest yet with 85% percent of pupils achieving the expected standard in reading, writing and maths. This places Woodcroft 23% above the national figure and 13% ahead of the Barnet average. This builds on previously strong 2024 results which exceeded national outcomes in every subject. These achievements reflect strong teaching, an ambitious curriculum and consistently high expectations. Early Years outcomes continue to improve; phonics remains a strength; and Year 4 multiplication scores sit above national benchmarks. Pupils excel beyond statutory measures too: Woodcroft placed 2nd out of 355 schools in London in the Times Tables Rock Stars competition, with 6C named the top class in London.

Alongside academic strength, Woodcroft pupils benefit from a rich and varied offer. National dance finals, Royal Albert Hall choir performances, ukulele and strings concerts, the WOW Factor Talent Shows, Bushcraft residentials, Thames21 river fieldwork, Bikeability training, intensive swimming, museum visits, VE Mail letters to a WWII veteran and the summer fair all broaden horizons. This year's EYFS garden nomination at the Barnet Young Gardeners Awards was another example of purposeful learning and collective effort, with children tending the garden before summer and staff sustaining it through the heatwave. These experiences reinforce the wider educational journey that characterises the school.

Woodcroft has also taken a leading role in Barnet's move to become the first smartphone-free borough in the country. Our policy supports a calmer, safer learning environment, complemented by AIM@Digital, which promotes purposeful, high-quality use of technology.

On behalf of the Governing Body, I want to pay tribute to Mr Tallon, Mr Russell and the senior leadership team, as well as to every member of staff. The positive climate, strong outcomes and breadth of opportunities our pupils enjoy reflect your professionalism and care. I also thank our families for the trust you place in the school and the support you show throughout the year.

I would also like to acknowledge the Governing Body. Governors volunteer significant time to provide strategic scrutiny and support, helping the school maintain a clear long-term focus. Their contribution is quiet but essential. This term we welcome our new parent governors, whose insight will strengthen the board as we continue to serve the community.

Woodcroft is a diverse, ambitious and values-driven school. As governors, we are proud of what has been achieved. We wish all pupils, staff, parents and carers a peaceful Christmas break and a happy New Year. We look forward to continuing our work in 2026. Together. Towards. Success.

School Performance Results for 2025

- Please, only supply pre-packed cakes and biscuits that come with ingredient lists (So that means no home baked cakes even though they are the best!)
- Avoid cakes or savoury items that require cutting in school staff just don't have time!

PARTY FOOD GUIDANCE

At the end of term pupils will be celebrating with their annual Festive Class Parties. This is a time for some festive fun and games. Food is an important part of any celebration, and families traditionally send in a plate of food for sharing. **We would like this tradition to continue at Woodcroft**. However, in school we have a number of important things to consider. These include children with allergies, vegetarian and religious diets, safe food preparation, government healthy eating guidance and the school food policy. *If only life was simple!* We do have a number of pupils with **severe nut allergies** currently in school, so we have to take these considerations <u>very seriously</u>.

Please note: If you DO NOT wish your child to participate in the food aspect of a class party please let your class teacher know with a message in the Homelink Book. We recommend that parents who withdraw their child from sharing food at parties send in a separately labelled lunch box with party food items for their child. These individual party box items must still follow the checklist below:

Party food checklist:

- Only provide items that DO NOT contain nuts Woodcroft is a NUT FREE school
- No chocolate sweets / bars
- No fizzy drinks
- Fruit juices should ideally not contain added sugar
- Only supply pre-packed cakes and biscuits that come with ingredient lists (*So that means <u>no home baked cakes even though they are the best!*)</u>
- Please avoid cakes or items that require cutting in school

- ❖ Sausage rolls or veggie sausage rolls
- Sausages / veggie sausages
- ♦ Samosas / spring rolls (vegetable is best then everyone can share)
- Pizza slices

- Sandwiches (various fillings) no nut or chocolate spreads please
- Crisps and Popcorn
- Salad items cherry tomatoes / mini cucumbers / carrot sticks
- Small fruit (satsumas, small bananas, washed cut grapes, etc)
- Non chocolate biscuits or individual cakes (in packaging with an ingredients label)

We understand the difficulties; however schools have got to consider the well-being of every individual. Thank you for your understanding and support on this matter.

Reminder about Birthday Bags and Treats: Please do not send in cakes & sweets for birthdays

Because of severe food allergies and individual dietary requirements we need to closely monitor all food in school. Unfortunately, this poses a problem when birthday treats are brought in – often late in the day! We therefore **DO NOT accept sweets and cakes as birthday treats**. We realise that this can be frustrating, however please understand that teachers are responsible for the health of all of the 30

For this reason we promote our **Birthday Book Club** scheme and suggest a book instead of sweets.

Reminder: Children can come to school in party clothes on the day of their party. A suitable coat and footwear for break time and lunch are essential!
