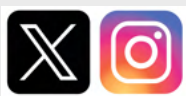

Woodcroft is a Smartphone Free School



We want your child to be healthy, safe and successful at school. We believe that for primary age children a smartphone has the potential to do significant harm. As a result, the Governing Body of Woodcroft has decided to make our school smartphone free. This means pupils will not be allowed to bring a smartphone or smart watch into school.

If older children absolutely need a phone for safety when travelling independently to and from school then they will be allowed to bring a traditional feature phone that allows calls and texts only.

Our first session is about 'Sounds Write' phonics. This is the approach we use to teach children the letter sounds within words. They then practice 'blending' these together to help them begin to read and write. Come along and find out how you can help your child get off to the best start in their reading journey.

Swimming Lessons For Year 3 and Year 4



Year 3 and 4 will each be taking part in an intensive week long swimming course this half term. The one hour lessons take place every day at the Copthall Pool. Pupils will be travelling by coach. This is a compulsory unit of the national curriculum.

Pupils will need:

- a suitable kit bag (not their school bag as it will get wet)
- a one piece swimming costume or trunks
- a swimming hat (compulsory for both girls and boys)
- a towel
- goggles are optional



Pupils are **not** allowed to wear two piece bikinis or long swimming shorts. It is also important to bring a warm jacket/coat for the journey. Snacks can be brought to eat back in school.

Nursery admissions from age 3 years old

Woodcroft Nursery accepts applications for children to start from the age of 3 years old.

We enrol children at the start of each term after they are three:

- For a **September** start date a child must turn 3 before 31st August.
- For a **January** start date a child must turn 3 between 1st September and 31st December.
- For an **April** start date a child must turn 3 before 31st March

Children can then apply to start our Reception class from the September of the year they will become 4 years old.

Reception height and weight checks



Every year in England, children in Reception have their height and weight measured as part of the National Child Measurement Programme (NCMP). Your child's Reception class will take part in this year's measurement programme on Monday (19th January 2026).

The measurements will be carried out by the Barnet School Nursing Team at school in a private space away from other pupils. Children will be measured fully clothed except for their coats and shoes. Parents do not need to do anything to enable their child to take part. However, should you wish to opt-out of the check the details of how to do this were provided previously in the parent letter. Crime and Community Safety

Met Engage is a fairly new police platform for raising issues directly with the police and also receiving updates on arrests, security measures, etc. In the past couple of years, reporting by residents has made a key difference to catching drug-dealers, burglars etc. as part of extensive operations and arrests in the area, supported by the Council's upgraded and expanded CCTV system (including 2 mobile units) and community safety team as appropriate.
