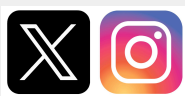

We use the **Arbor booking facility** to schedule all meetings. These will be held in your child's classroom.

How to arrange a meeting

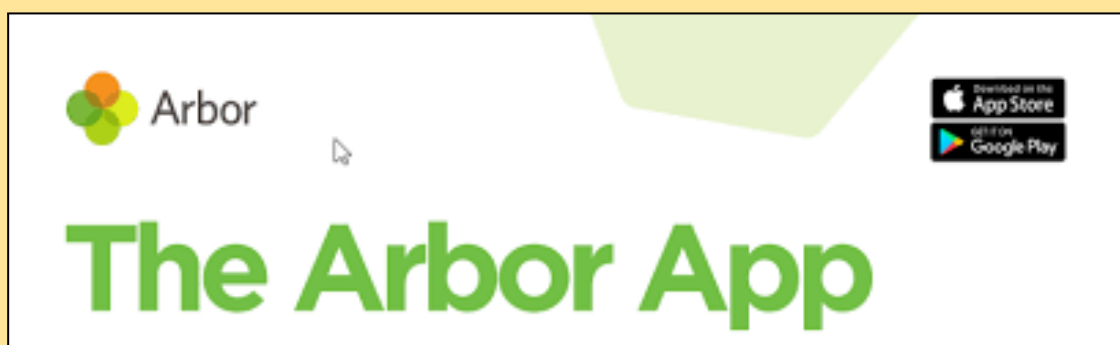
1. Log into your **Arbor Parent Account**
2. Scroll down and click **Guardian Consultation**
3. Select your child in the **Meetings** section
4. Click **Time Slot** and select an available appointment from the drop down list
5. Finally click the green **Book Time Slot** and select **YES** you are sure
6. You will receive a confirmation email and also be able to see your meeting time on your Arbor App



What happens on the day

1. Please arrive at school in good time before your appointment
2. Make your way to your child's classroom - staff will be on hand to direct you if you are unsure where to go
3. Class teachers will invite you into the classroom to discuss your child's progress
4. Appointments will be strictly limited to 10 minutes. If you require more time teachers will schedule a follow up meeting at a mutually convenient time.
5. Pupils are welcome to attend with their parents. But try to avoid bringing younger preschool siblings as this can cause a distraction

Road Safety Concerns on Watling Avenue

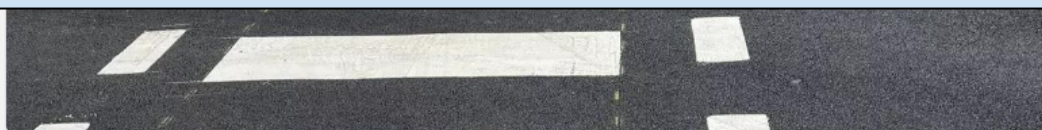

Nursery admissions from age 3 years old

Woodcroft Nursery accepts applications for children to start at ages 3 and 4 years old.

We enrol children at the start of each term after they are three:

- For a **September** start date a child must turn 3 before 31st August.
- For a **January** start date a child must turn 3 between 1st September and 31st December.
- For an **April** start date a child must turn 3 before 31st March

Children can then apply to start our Reception class from the September of the year they will become 4 years old.

Crime and Community Safety

Met Engage is a fairly new police platform for raising issues directly with the police and also receiving updates on arrests, security measures, etc. In the past couple of years, reporting by residents has made a key difference to catching drug-dealers, burglars etc. as part of extensive operations and arrests in the area, supported by the Council's upgraded and expanded CCTV system (including 2 mobile units) and community safety team as appropriate.
