

To celebrate World Book Day on 5th March teachers will be sharing some of their favourite extracts from the story in assembly with the pupils.


Mad Hatter Day 5th March

Keep Britain Tidy Poster Competition

A message from Sara Conway (Barnet Councillor - Burnt Oak)



Keep Britain Tidy's 'Great British Spring Clean' is coming up in March. This seems a good time to work with the Burnt Oak schools to launch a 'design a poster and campaign slogan'. Posters should aim at encouraging everyone to take better care of the local area by discouraging littering and urging people to use the bins provided, or to take their rubbish home.

We look forward to seeing pupils' bold and inspiring anti-littering messages. The winning entries for each school will be displayed as posters at all the local schools and in our councillor emails during March.

We can also arrange for litter pickers and bags to be provided for any school that would also like to do litter picks.

Here are some poster examples that may inspire you when you are planning your own poster.



Competition Details:

What: Poster Competition

Why: Encourage people to take care of the local area and not drop litter

When: Return by Tuesday 24th February (after half-term)

How: The competition will be judged by the School Council and Cllr Conway. The winners from each class will be published and displayed around the school and also shared by the local councillors.

Winners will receive a Litter Patrol badge and be invited to join the **Woodcroft's Litter Patrol** and take part in the Great British Spring Clean along with local councillors.

Woodcroft School Council is forming a Litter Patrol. The Litter Patrol will be joining local councillors and taking part in the Great British Spring Clean. Our new school council have invited Cllr Conway to their first meeting on Tuesday 10th February at 8.00am. PARENT/CARER CONSULTATION EVENINGS

We are holding our spring term parent consultation evenings on **Tuesday 10th and Thursday 12th February**. This will be an opportunity for you to discuss your child's progress and take a look at their work and books. We use the **Arbor booking facility** to schedule all meetings. These will be held in your child's classroom.

How to arrange a meeting

1. Log into your **Arbor Parent Account**
2. Scroll down and click **Guardian Consultation**
3. Select your child in the **Meetings** section
4. Click **Time Slot** and select an available appointment from the drop down list
5. Finally click the green **Book Time Slot** and select **YES** you are sure
6. You will receive a confirmation email and also be able to see your meeting time on your Arbor App



What happens on the day

1. Please arrive at school in good time before your appointment
2. Make your way to your child's classroom - staff will be on hand to direct you if you are unsure where to go
3. Class teachers will invite you into the classroom to discuss your child's progress
4. Appointments will be strictly limited to 10 minutes. If you require more time teachers will schedule a follow up meeting at a mutually convenient time.
5. Pupils are welcome to attend with their parents. But try to avoid bringing younger preschool siblings as this can cause a distraction


