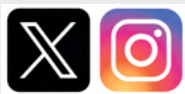

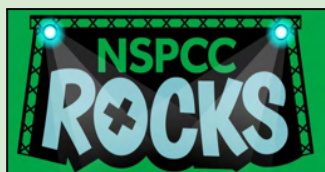

Early Years Maths Workshop

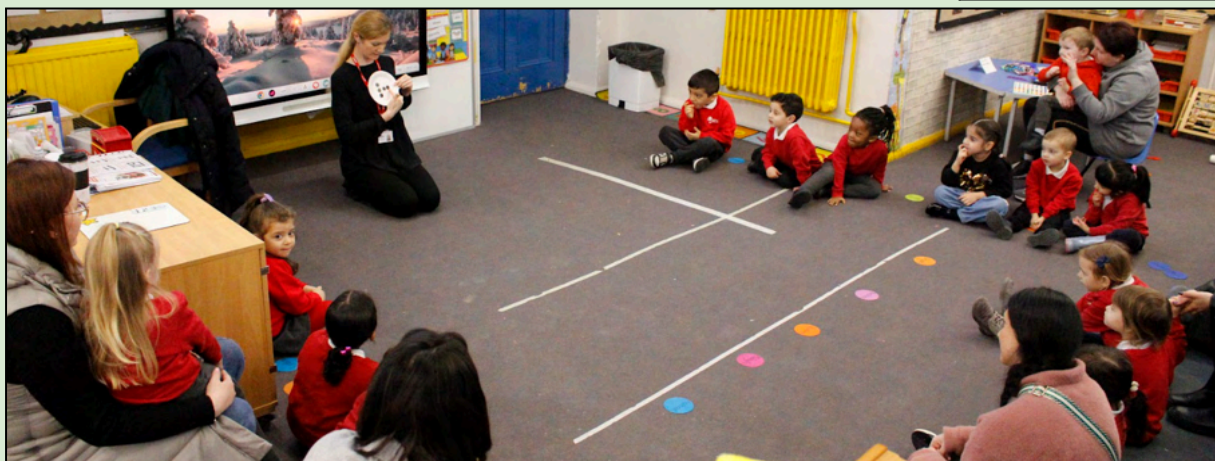

To celebrate World Book Day on 5th March teachers will be sharing some of their favourite extracts from the story in assembly with the pupils.

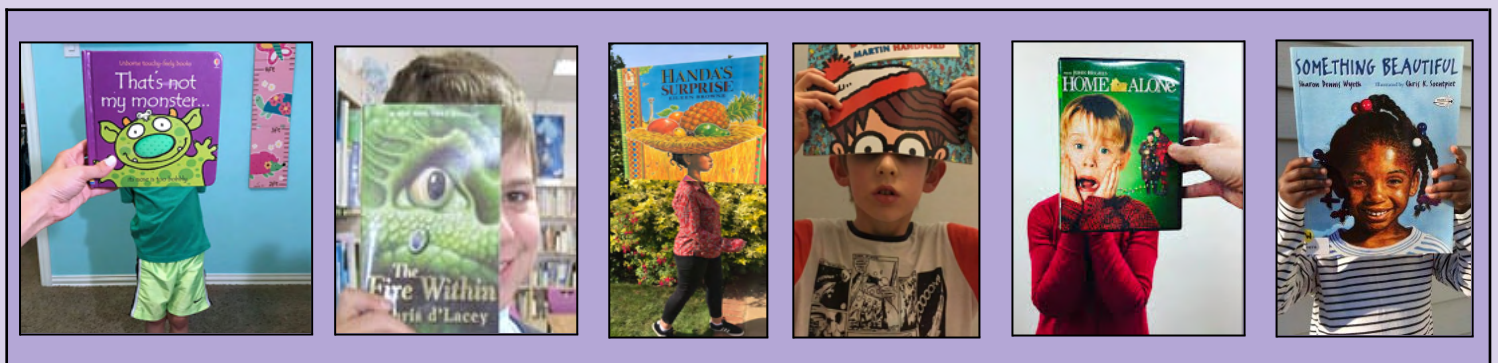
Mad Hatter Day 5th March

Road Safety Concerns on Watling Avenue



It was brought to the school's attention that families have experienced safety issues on the zebra crossing on Watling Avenue. This includes cars not stopping when pedestrians are on the crossing.

While it is important for the school to be aware of general concerns it is vital to report these directly to the police. **The failure of motorists to stop for pedestrians at a zebra crossing is a police matter. School Survey and Road Safety Officer Observation

We conducted a parent survey to gather information and invited a Barnet's Road Safety Officer to come and observe the crossing in operation.

Following this work we are proposing the following actions:

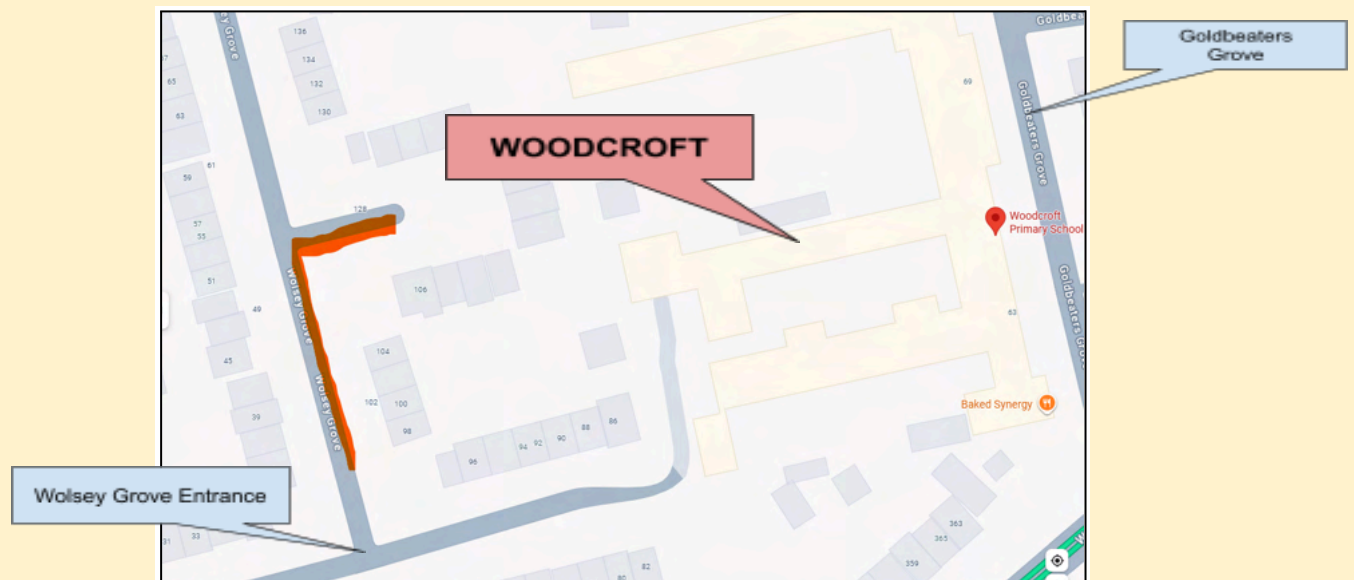
- Raising this matter with the School's Governing Body for ongoing consideration
- Barnet Road Safety Workshops organised for pupils on 26th February 2026
- To update the School Travel Plan
- Request better road signage to alert drivers to the crossing on Watling Avenue
- Encouraging parents to report dangerous driving to the police

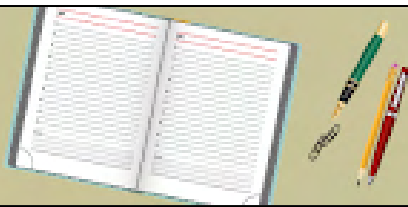

Ramadan



This year, Ramadan is expected to begin on the evening of 17th February, and will conclude on the evening of 18th March 2026, with the exact dates dependent upon the sighting of the moon.

At Woodcroft we recognise the importance of Ramadan and aim to fully support our Muslim pupils through this period.

Fasting

Some of our older KS2 pupils may be fasting while at school. We require parents/carers to write **a letter, or note in a pupils' homelink book**, to inform the school of the days that their child will be fasting.

Prayer

We offer supervised spaces for girls and boys to pray at lunchtime after the sun has reached its height at mid-afternoon. A time for prayer and reflection is provided between 1.00pm and 1.30pm. We expect children observing prayer to be responsible and well behaved. Prayer mats can be brought into school and left in the main hall.

Lessons

We expect all pupils to take part in **every** school lesson and activity. If an aspect of the lesson proves difficult for a child due to religious observance then the teacher will modify aspects of their participation. For example, pupils may help the teacher during PE instead of doing vigorous exercise.

Events

If a specific event is taking place such as a test, school trip, dance competition or sports match we ask that an older child has their parents' approval to break a fast on that day to enable them to take part. Also, if a child has a weekly sports club, e.g. Dance or Football, then parents may either decide that their child does not fast on those particular days of the week, or the child does not attend during Ramadan. Please notify your child's club teacher of any decision. However, it may not be safe to carry out additional vigorous exercise while fasting.
