

PE and Sports Premium Policy and Impact Document 2019-2020 Academic Year

Mission statement

"Excellence for Everyone"

'At West Oaks School we work with consideration, commitment and co-operation to ensure our school community will develop the capacity to enjoy life and succeed.'

We are determined to ensure that our pupils have every chance to realize their full potential and lead healthy and active lifestyles. Sports premium funding is used to enhance our PE and Sports offer.

Background

The government has provided funding to provide substantial additional funding for primary school sport. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health, Culture, Media and Sport. The money goes directly to primary school head teachers/principals to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

Accountability is with the Principal and Senior Leaders who decide how to use the premium. They report the decisions to the governors, describing how the money has been used along with the impact of the initiatives introduced. The report is then published on the school website.

At West Oaks, we are strongly committed to PE and sports. This is evident in the wide range of activities in and out of school we offer. We also have specialist staff who support us in delivering high quality PE provision on all our sites as we recognize the benefits of PE and sport can have on the attitudes, confidence, well-being and academic achievement of all our children.

2019-2020 Sports premium

We received £17,090 in 2019/20.

Our curriculum reflects our commitment to using physical activities to enhance physical and emotional development. The purpose of expenditure has been to extend the number of children taking part in new activities. Children who are least interested in sports have also been targeted to increase participation in physical activities.

We have used our sports premium grant to:

- Organise and run two whole school sports events (£500).
- Extend support from specialist sports coaches into school to deliver sports programmes (£2,000).
- Extend sports resources and motivational resources (£450).
- Provide opportunities to engage in sport to pupils who are reluctant to participate (£430).
- Purchase of new equipment for new activities (£1,650).
- Contribution towards PE Champion role (£8,364)
- Contribution to Transport to events horse riding etc. (£900).
- New play equipment (£2,796)

How has the Sports Premium made a difference to the attainment of the pupils?

By using sport to effectively target support and intervention, we are noticing improvements in pupil communication and interaction. Using sport as an intervention tool alongside integrated school systems benefits all our primary aged pupils.

50% of pupils have been introduced and participated in new activities (climbing wall, exercise mile, horse riding etc.) and they continue to engage in the activity in 2019/20 (more than two occasions).

Improved teaching and learning in PE, a wider range of activities offered and better areas to play and participate in PE have been developed because of this PE and Sports Government grant.

A designated member of the SLG maintains an overview of sports premium spending.

The Chair of Governors has the responsibility for sports premium monitoring.

2020-2021 Sports premium

The PE grant for 2020/21 is provisionally £18,058.

We intend to continue to improve our PE/Sports facilities so our 2020/21 West Oaks Sports and PE grant will fund:
