Dear Parent/Carer

You are now into the second week of the summer holidays and for many of you the next few weeks will seem an exciting prospect, but for others, it will seem a long time ahead until your children return to the academy in September. We really have had another fantastic year at the academy, again we welcomed a full cohort of Year 7 students in September and they have lived up to our expectations. A whole variety of successes have been achieved by both the staff and the students with lots to celebrate throughout the year. Our website is worth a look on a weekly basis as we post the good news on the front page daily.

The Summer Term has been particularly busy with the recruitment of the new Principal, Mike Adnitt, who has been my Vice Principal since we opened in 2008. Mike will be an outstanding Principal and I am certain the academy will go from strength to strength. He has the full support of all the staff and Trustees and is well respected by all the students.

- James Stainton will leave the academy to pursue a career in teaching. He is a fantastic member of staff and will start his training to be a PE teacher, as from September 2017.
- Mike Shepherd is one of our Maths teachers and will be leaving us to take up a new opportunity at The Samuel Lister Academy in Bradford. We wish him well.
- Cheryl Douglas who is one of our LTAs has decided to retire, she has been a real strength to the Inclusion Team, we hope she has a long, happy, healthy retirement.

We wish them all well, and on your behalf we would like to thank them all for their relentless hard work, commitment and loyalty to the academy – they will be missed, by both the staff and the students.

We believe we have appointed some outstanding new members of staff to replace those who are leaving:

- John Paul Hogan will be joining the Science Department as a Newly Qualified Teacher to replace Lianne Storr. He has done part of his teacher training with us in 2016/17 and many of the students already know him. I believe he will be a great addition to the academy.
- Deanna Black will be joining the PE Department as their LTA and Technician.
- We will be replacing Mike Shepherd with Julia Hayne who is an IT/Maths Teacher and will be with us for the Autumn Term.

Three members of staff are getting married in the summer, Helen Parker our Extended Services Coordinator and House Leader for Amethyst, is getting married and her new name will be Helen Hill, our Subject Leader for Technology, Kate Bentley is also getting married and will be known as Kate Keyworth and Corrine Plaskitt one of our LTAs is also getting married and her new name will be Corrine Abraham, we wish them all the best for their weddings and look forward to seeing their photographs!

As you are already aware, our logo gives us a strong, vibrant and unique identity which represents our talented, bright community. We hope you all still continue to like it as much as we do. Not only do the flames and grid iron represent the story of St Lawrence who was an early Christian martyr in the third century, but the brightly coloured flames also represent the treasures of the church, who were his congregation.



We feel that the metal and flames are representative of the steel works in Scunthorpe which are a very important part of the local community. There are five flames on the logo and each flame represents our **five core values of Truth, Justice, Respect, Forgiveness and Generosity**. They also represent our five house colours which are named after precious gem stones or metals.

All our students are in one of the houses and their tutor group reflects which one, e.g. 7G are in the Gold House, 7R are in Ruby etc.... You will notice that all the students are organised according to their age into year groups, they all have more than one tutor assigned to their group and an Achievement Team Leader (ATL) who is the head of that particular year group. A member of the Senior Leadership Team (SLT) coordinates the year groups to ensure that the correct balance of support and challenge is given to every student in order that they are expected to and able to, achieve their potential, and make significant progress, both socially and academically.

The Achievement Team Leader stays with their year group throughout their time at the academy and you are always encouraged to liaise with them if you have any concerns. The ATL is supported by a Student Progress Leader (SPL) who monitors and supports the students to help remove barriers to learning, if there are any. Again, they are always available if you need to contact the academy and the ATL is unavailable for any reason. All subjects have a Subject Leader and if you would like any advice, guidance or support about your child in a particular subject they would be the person with overall responsibility for a particular subject.

The St Lawrence Academy Uniform

We have attached our Uniform Policy for you to ensure you are reminded about what our expectations are in relation to uniform. Last year you were all wonderful in relation to ensuring your child was appropriately dressed – thank you.

The Year 6 students have now all been measured up for their uniform and orders have been placed with the supplier. Once delivered, either to the academy or to home, the uniform will then be ready for when the students join the academy.

Breakfast Club

Once again our breakfast club will continue in the Central Atrium so that those students, who do not eat breakfast before leaving home, will have the opportunity to have their breakfast at the Academy. This is from 7:30am in the Central Atrium.

Lunch time

Students are not allowed off the premises at lunch time as we believe they are safer, more settled in the afternoon and ready for learning if they stay onsite. It gives them the opportunity to chat to friends and have time to leisurely eat their lunch or go to the LRC, the Sports Hall, games club or get involved in the active lunch time programme/Nurture or to a club. We will continue to timetable the lunch periods so that students spend significantly less time queuing for their food and have more time to eat and relax.

Data Protection Act

Throughout the year we encourage staff to take photographs of our students learning or when they are out on school trips. We like to put up displays around the Academy to celebrate student achievements and we also want to continue developing our website.

We would therefore like your permission to display images for celebratory purposes of your child. We are also regularly visited by the media to celebrate the talents of your children as we always try to promote their successes when we can; again we need your permission. Please let us know if you object to us doing this, otherwise we will assume you are happy about us using these positive images. Thank you.

Use of Technologies

We are very keen for students to use a variety of different technologies and we have made significant investments again for some new equipment for next year. We have a suite of new computers in technology and have new ICT rooms for media work and other computer based courses. Can I please ask you all to monitor your child's use of their computer at home in relation to "Facebook, Twitter etc..." as sometimes they may use it inappropriately, or, they may be sharing too much personal information.

It would be wise to check their privacy settings so that they are not sharing information too widely as sometimes this can result in safeguarding concerns. There are some excellent "Digital Parenting" guidance booklets available free from Vodaphone which you may find helpful.

Mobile Phones

Students should not bring mobile phones into the Academy; if they are seen or heard they will be confiscated. If a student brings one into the Academy, and it is lost or stolen, we will not take any responsibility. If a student needs to contact home during the day they can use one of our telephones.

Home Circumstances

If the situation you find yourselves in at home changes for any reason i.e. someone is taken ill, unable to do what they normally do etc. and this has a potential impact on your child, in relation to their health and well-being, could you please let us know, confidentially, so that we can put in place appropriate support, as and when needed. If any of your children are classified as a "Young Carer," can you please let us know.

Free School Meals

If your child is entitled to free meals, please ensure you have filled in the relevant forms and please encourage them to eat their school lunch.

Medical Information

Our Student Services provide a basic first aid service for all students but they do not give specific medical advice. If an illness or injury occurs outside of school hours it is your responsibility to follow this up, please do not rely on us to do so. Any medication, if sent into the academy, must always be in the original packaging and clearly labelled, and importantly, antibiotics must be managed at home, not in the academy.

Changing Groups

Occasionally throughout the year students may be moved from one set to another in a particular subject where they are set based on their ability/attainment/progress... If we feel a student's teaching set needs to be changed, we will always contact you to explain the reasons. However, at the end of an academic year when we look at the year group as a whole, we may put these changes in place for the beginning of September without specifically contacting you. Once your child returns, when they are told which set they are in, please feel free to contact the relevant subject area if you have any queries.

Banding Arrangements

All of our Year 7, Year 8, Year 9 and Year 10 students are now placed in one of two bands based on their combined ability in English, Maths and Science, along with their performance in lessons and in the standardised, externally marked Progress Tests for English, Maths and Science. The names of the two bands are Polaris and Sirius – Polaris is the North Star and is the brightest star in the Ursa Minor and Sirius is the brightest star in the night sky because of its luminosity and its proximity to earth. Students will be placed in Polaris or Sirius and will follow a curriculum that best suits their progress and abilities at this current time.

Catching Up

Students are all aware that if they are absent from any lessons due to going on a trip, being involved in a special activity or absent from the academy for any another reason, they need to catch up on the work they have missed. We want all students to make the best progress possible and fulfil their potential and therefore every lesson is very important – hence, they need to complete the work that the rest of the class did in their absence. They can stay behind to do this at the academy or they can complete it at home and we would appreciate your support in ensuring that the work is completed – Thank you.

<u>Homework</u>

Homework notebooks are issued at the beginning of each academic year for students to record their homework/coursework expectations. As parents you can also check via Show My Homework (SMHW) what has been set, when, and by which member of staff as you can then track what your child is expected to do.

We want to work in partnership with a range of people, especially you as parents/carers, along with others from the local community to make sure that the Academy can provide the best possible education for your children. We recognise how important it is to have the support of all the staff, parents and students and we hope that our partnership with you will continue to grow over the coming years. Our mission statement reflects our vision: **Strength for today, Bright Hope for tomorrow** and we are very optimistic about the future, especially after having had another very successful year.

We have appointed some fantastic staff at the academy who are very excited about their role and being part of The St Lawrence Academy and we believe we have an excellent team of staff who will inspire your children to do their best.
