


Keelman's Way Qualifications and Accreditation



Equals Accreditation

We use **Equals Moving On** as a curriculum framework which gives a broad and balanced range of learning opportunities for pupils with the flexibility to personalise individual learning based on a pupils needs or interests.

The Equals Curriculum is divided into the following areas: World Studies Science, Technology, Foreign Cultures, Creativity and Humanities Independent Living PSHE, Citizenship, Leisure and Recreation, Daily Living Skills Vocational Studies Work Skills, Careers Education/ Post School Planning. Pupils achieve annual accreditation Through Equals.



ASDAN Qualifications

The Equals curriculum is combined and linked closely with qualifications in:



ASDAN Personal Progress - These qualifications have been developed for learners working towards and at Entry 1 to have their achievements recognised. These include units covering Literacy, Numeracy, Independent Living Skills, Personal Development, Preparation for Work and Community Participation.


ASDAN Personal, Social Development - Entry 1-3 qualifications

ASDAN Employability qualifications provide a framework for developing and recognising general employability skills at Entry 2 and Entry 3.





Literacy

Our 14-19 curriculum includes the **NCFE Qualification in Functional English** at Entry

Level 1,2 and 3. This allows pupils to gain
accreditation in the use and functionality of
English through the study of short, simple texts
that explain or recount information. All sessions
within assessment modules will have a topical
interest.

e.g., music, weather, pets and keep-fit.

Maths

Pupils working at Entry level 1,2 and 3 may achieve an AQA Qualification in Functional Maths as well as the NCFE Qualification in Functional Maths. Children are supported through the AQA qualification using exam papers as well as coursework to support their achievements when needed. The qualification in functional Maths allows children to complete modules whereby they apply maths skills in real life situations such as within a bakers or a mobile phone shop.





Pupils also achieve recognition through the **Duke of Edinburgh Award** scheme - we have had pupils achieve their Gold award.

Pupils skills in conservation, horticulture and environment are recognised through the **John Muir Award** and pupil achievement in creativity through the **Arts Award** scheme.
