

Keelman's Way School



Provision for pupils with areas of need in

- Communication and interaction
- Cognition and learning
- Sensory needs

Pupils are likely to have *areas* of need in two or more of these categories and may have additional diagnoses e.g. ASD, SLD.

Pupils will be assessed at Range 3-5, on South Tyneside ranges criteria, Band C or D, some with 1-1 for place values.

Pupils will be offered a sensory based curriculum aimed at developing communication and social skills. It will be focussed around the semi-formal pathway offered to Keelman's pupils.

The pupils will continue to be very much a part of the Keelman's community with strong connections to the main body of the school. Pupils will continue to have access to school facilities and community events as well as the well developed resources within the new base. The new base is very spacious and has excellent outdoor provision. Children will continue to access the wider community on Educational visits.

Parents will be able to access the same support as is experienced in the main school.

Staff are established Keelman's Staff with the skills needed to meet the needs of all pupils. Group sizes will be small and staffed to reflect pupil complex needs
