



## **Mortimer Primary School**

### **PE and Sports Funding 2020-2021**

#### What is the PE and Sports Funding?

The government is currently providing additional funding to improve provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on the delivery of PE and sport in school. Each school receives £16000, plus £10 per pupil on roll (Y1-Y6) in January 2020. This year our total grant is £20725. In addition, £45670 was carried over from previous years. This carry over figure is principally due to the time taken to finalise the new canopy that is being constructed in the KS2 yard.

#### How will we invest this at Mortimer Primary School?

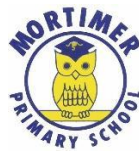
