

## **Mortimer Primary School**

### **PE and Sports Funding 2014-2015**

#### What is the PE and Sports Funding?

The government is currently providing additional funding of £150 million pounds each year to improve provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on the delivery of PE and sport in school. Each school receives £8000, plus £5 per pupil on roll in January 2014. This year our total grant is £10415.

#### How will we invest this at Mortimer Primary School?

At Mortimer our aim is to ensure a lasting legacy for the additional funding. Our plan is to use the money to maximise the long term impact of our PE provision for pupils and staff.

#### Provision Plan 2014-2015

Many of the initiatives we plan are based on those which were successful last year (please see summary of our PE Sports Grant Expenditure).
