Medieval knights had to have all these qualities, as well as:

- Always being prepared for battle
- Seeking revenge if insulted

These qualities fell under a code called chivalry.

Once a knight put on their armour, they had to be able to tell others whose side they were on. To do this their armour and shields were patterned.

- Armour had to follow a rule of complex meanings and patterns called heraldry.
- Patterns and colours had meanings.
- Designs could use up to 5 colours.
- Shields were divided into basic shapes
- Each shape had a charge which was an image that represented something about them or their family
- Often their shields would be incorporated into a larger design called a Coat of arms
