

What will students do during this unit?	AQA Scheme of Assessment Students will explore Shakespeare's methods in Macbeth. Students will be able to understand how to analyse both language and structure, including the key thematic elements in Macbeth. Students will understand the relationship between texts and when and why it was written.	AQA Scheme of Assessment Students will read and analyse Priestley's play in chronological order, focusing on key scenes in order to analyse language, link to context and Priestley's influences. The final element will be critical analysis of the play exploring class, social constructs and the themes of responsibility and change.	AQA Scheme of Assessment Students develop their ability to compare and analyse poetry. They will study the remaining poems from the AQA anthology (Power and Conflict Cluster) and practice making critical comparisons between the poets' use of method, their intentions when writing and impacts on the reader.	AQA Scheme of Assessment Students will consolidate their understanding of how to approach, analyse and evaluate an unseen poem using the 4-part method. They will then look at how to compare the effects of language of one poem to another completely unseen poem.
