<b>Topics</b>	Weimar and Nazi Germany, 1918–39	The American West, c1835–c1895	Revision and exam preparation.
<b>What will students during this unit?</b>	Students will continue with this unit from the end of year 10. At the start of the unit students will learn about the legacy of the First World War, the origins of the Weimar Republic and what weaknesses this government faced. Students will also study the reasons for the growth of the Hitler and the Nazi party which allowed this party to take control of Germany and the impact this had on the people of Germany. Students will also be developing their source based enquiry skills looking in depth at a range of historical sources and interpretations of events.	Students will learn about the development of America and the impact this had on the way of life of the Native Americans. Students will start the course by focusing on the traditions and culture of the Native Americans and how this differed to the white settlers. Students will then move to look at the policies put in place by the settlers and the impact this had on the way of life of native tribes & nations, resulting in conflict between the two. Finally, students will study how the growth and development of America wiped out their traditional way of life and how they reacted to this threat.	Students will be spending the remainder of the year revising the four topics they will study at GCSE. During this unit of study students will be recapping both prior knowledge and exam skills of all for units in preparation for their summer exams. Students will be taught how best to approach each of the exams with a focus on exam techniques and will be required to do practise exam questions and act as the examiner in order to mark sample answers to allow students to gain a better understanding of the exam requirements.

<b>How will students be assessed?</b>	Students will be assessed according to the exam board specification for Paper 3. This exam will be 1 hour 30 minutes in length and will focus on the analysis of sources and interpretations to construct a balanced argument plus an analysis of knowledge recall.	Students will be assessed according to the exam board specification for Paper 2. This exam will be 50 minutes in length and will include three knowledge based questions of the events studied.	Students will be assessed according to the requirements of the Edexcel specification for all papers and question types.
