

Advanced

Across Greater Manchester, and in particular in Tameside, there are some of the lowest rates of girls taking STEM subjects further than GCSE level. We want to change this! We have worked with Ashton Sixth Form College and the <u>Advanced Mathematical Support Programme</u> to deliver an A Level taster session to a group of our Year 10 female students who are interested in further study of Mathematics.

Two of our former students who now study mathematics at some of the top universities in England also attended as special guests, and gave the opportunity for our current students to ask some really good questions about further study.

Maths!

We discussed some amazing female mathematicians who made ground breaking discoveries: Ada Lovelace, Florence Nightingale and Marie Curie, which was really inspiring. Students looked at the fun and challenging jobs that STEM education can help them to achieve and that just taking an A Level in Mathematics could increase their lifetime earnings up to 11%.

All of the students were a credit to themselves and got really stuck in with the maths. Well done! And we hope they are inspired to take Maths in the future.

STEM and careers

Four Year 10 students have also been successful in their application to attend a Science University Summer School. The STEM event, run by GM Higher, aims to give students experience of life at university. The students have taken part in a 3 day residential event, alongside students from different schools across Greater Manchester, involving experiencing lectures in Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Life Sciences.


Ready Salted Day!

On Monday 10th July, 30 year 4 students from 3 feeder primary schools attended Ready Salted Day: this is a science and maths aspirational day held at the College.

During the day, the year 4 students discussed the importance of making **healthy** choices with regards to diet, particularly in relation to salt. We discussed what foods contain salt and where salt comes from.

The year 4 students extracted pure salt from rock salt in science. In their maths sessions, they calculated the energy content in different brands of ready salted crisps and used the equipment in the fitness suite to relate this energy content to movement and exercise.

We are looking forward to meeting them again soon as part of our Year 5 work with partner primaries.
