UNIFORM GUIDANCE

Year 7

- Plain charcoal grey tailored trousers or pleated DCC skirt only skirts must be purchased from the school supplier (no denim, canvas, cord, low rise, skinny or fashion trousers or skirts allowed).
- White shirt/blouse only.
- School blazer with Denton Community College logo.
- Year 7 School tie

Footwear: Plain black, polishable, leather shoes only. No trainers. No boots are allowed.

Coats: Plain, single colour outer coat with no prominent logo.

No other outer garments e.g. hooded tops or sweatshirts.

Hair: Natural colours only and no inappropriate styles

(we reserve the right to judge each individual case on merit).



UNIFORM GUIDANCE

No jewellery is to be worn at anytime – this includes ear piercings.

Ties: Appropriately worn tie compulsory for **all** students. As guidance the tie should cover all buttons down the front of a students shirt.

Tights: Tights must be black and must always be worn with skirts (60 denier)

Socks: Plain black - no knee length socks

Trousers: Must not be tucked into socks; no leggings, footless tights or knee

high socks for girls.

Make-Up: not allowed in any form.

Hair bobbles / bands must be black or purple.

Smart watches and mobile phones are not permitted in the school.



KS3 EBACC EXPERIENCES

- Three to four exciting experiences and events per year to take place throughout each year of Key Stage 3.
- All experiences are designed to feed into and explore a range of topics from different subjects that make up the English Baccalaureate.
- Through these, we strive to motivate and inspire our students, and guide them when selecting their GCSE 'Options' for further study, having had opportunities to see these subjects applied in real life.
- Each 'Experience' is an entitlement for our students and, therefore, all
 Experiences are entirely free of charge.
- Throughout Year 7, your child will typically be invited to attend three to four 'Ebacc Experiences' - each designed to be culturally enriching, academically stimulating and contribute to a vibrant and varied cocurriculum.

DCC Transition Day Thursday 4th July

- Students must attend in their primary school uniform and trainers.
- The students will follow an amended school day which runs from 9.00am until 2.00pm.
- Students are advised not to attend until 9am and not to return to their primary school at the end of the school day.
- Students are expected to bring the basic school equipment of a school bag, pen, pencil and ruler; any other equipment required for lessons or activities will be provided at school.
- On the Transition day, students will be met at the main Taylor Lane entrance by members of our pastoral team, Senior Leadership Team and Student Voice.
- Students will have full access to our catering facilities and will not be charged for any food or drinks at break or lunchtime.
- Students are also welcome to bring a packed lunch if they prefer but they will not be allowed to leave the school site at lunch time.
- Whilst students are allowed to bring mobile phones to the school during the Transition day, they must not be used either in lessons or during social times and must be kept in their school bag on silent.
- Students can be collected from the main Taylor Lane entrance from 2pm.
