Fire Safety

Next term we are educating all students on fire safety. At this time of year we often hold assemblies and workshops regarding fire safety. Bonfire night can be a exciting experience for children and adults, but it comes with its dangers. We are keen to work with parents and carers to educate our students on fire safety and how to keep safe.



Enough to make the fuel ignite and burn

Parent and Carer Information

Teach children to STOP-DROP-and-**ROLL** if their clothes catch on fire. Stop (don't run), drop to the ground and cover your face with your hands. Then roll over and over or back and forth until the fire is out.

Help children understand how and when to call 999 for help. If there is a home fire, children should evacuate before calling 999. Children only need to call 999 if an adult is not able to do so.

Fire Stations

There are 4 fire stations in Tameside, these are: Ashton-Under-Lyne, Mossley, Hyde, and Stalybridge.

Bonfires:

The Fire brigade don't recommend having a bonfire in your garden. They can easily get out of hand and spread quickly to hedges, overhanging trees and garages, even to the house.



Staying safe on bonfire night:

Fireworks and sparklers:

- Watching fireworks is popular and fun. But fireworks are explosives and potentially dangerous, so they need careful handling and storage.
- Only buy fireworks that are CE marked.
- Don't drink alcohol if setting off fireworks.
- Keep fireworks in a closed box.
- Follow the instructions on each
- Light them at arms length, using a taper.
- Stand well back.
- Never go near a firework that has been lit. Even if it hasn't gone off it could still explode.
- Never put fireworks in your pocket or throw them.
- Always supervise children around fireworks.
- Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves.
- Never give sparklers to a child under five.
- Keep pets indoors.
- Don't set off noisy fireworks late at night and never after 11pm.
