Can read aloud all of the HFW, up to and including the Y 1 and 2 CEW list (demonstrating fluent and automatic reading and understanding of commonly encountered words)						
Can read aloud with intonation, taking into account ,						
Can read words with contractions (e.g. I'm, I'll, we'll, she's) and understands that the apostrophe represents omitted letters						
Can use syllables to read unknown polysyllabic words, including knowledge of common prefixes and suffixes (e.g. un-im-por-tant)						
Can apply their phonic knowledge automatically enabling an increasing capacity to attend to meaning rather than decoding.
