<p>Name the 7 continents and locate them on a map and a globe.</p> <p>Name the world's oceans and locate them on a map and a globe.</p> <p>Understand that both a map and a globe show the same thing.</p> <p>Name the capital cities of England, Scotland, Wales and Ireland.</p> <p>Identify Great Britain as an island and find where they live on a map of the United Kingdom.</p>	<p>Describe the key features of a place using words like beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, mountain, sea, ocean, river, soil, valley, vegetation, season and weather.</p> <p>Describe some physical features of their own locality.</p> <p>Describe a place outside of Europe using geographical words.</p> <p>Explain what makes a locality special.</p> <p>Describe some of the features associated with an island.</p>	<p>Use geographical vocab to refer to human features, including: city, town, village, factory, farm, house, office, port, harbour and shop.</p> <p>To explain the facilities a village, town and city may need and give reasons.</p> <p>Describe some human features of their own locality, such as the jobs people do.</p> <p>Explain how jobs are different in different parts of the world.</p> <p>Explain how an area has been spoilt or improved and give reasons.</p>	<p>Use simple compass directions (North, South, East and West) and locational and directional language (near, far, left and right) to describe the location of features and routes on a map.</p> <p>Use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise basic landmarks and human and physical features.</p> <p>Label a diagram or photograph using some geographical words.</p> <p>Say what they like and don't like about their own locality and another locality like the seaside.</p> <p>Find out about a locality by using different sources of evidence and by asking questions to someone else.</p>
