Dear Children, Parents, Carers and Governors,

This week, in preparation for Anti Bullying Week, our phrase of the week was **"One kind word."** We have celebrated pupils who are consistently kind to others. Kindness encourages kindness. The Anti –Bullying Alliance surveyed young people last year and asked what they wanted Anti-Bullying Week 2021 to focus on. There was an overwhelming response that this week should be about hope. One small act of kindness, brightens someone's day. They in turn are more likely to go on and be kind to someone else. Stop bullying in its tracks and spread kindness. Well done to our stars of the week who make our school a safe and happy place.

Public Health continue to recommend that all schools introduce the following measures to reduce the transmission of Covid 19. We implemented all of these measures immediately and continue to do so.

1. All adults to wear face masks in communal areas in schools.

2. All parents and carers to wear face coverings when dropping off or collecting children.

3. PCR tests are recommended for all adults and pupils if they are a close contact of a positive case. If the test is negative, pupils can return to school, however they must stay at home if they go on to develop symptoms and be retested. A close contact means some one who you share a house with.

4. Assemblies, staff and governor meetings to be held virtually.

5. School is to limit visitors to school. Careful consideration will be given to each event.

6. Educational visits and residential visits. Careful consideration will have to be given to each visit as increased use of public transport for long periods increases the chances of transmitting Covid 19.

This week our children made a poppy field as part of our **Remembrance Day** work. Thanks to Miss Wilkinson our History Lead, for leading on this. I am sure we will all agree it is a fitting tribute to honour armed forces who have died in the line of duty.
