Dear Children, Parents, Carers and Governors,

Inter Faith Week this week and our word of the week was "diversity." During Assembly this morning our children delighted in sharing the different religions and celebrations they have been learning about this week. Our school is very inclusive and our children never cease to impress me with how well they celebrate and respect the uniqueness of each individual. A special mention to Heidi and Leland for contributing to Assembly this morning. Ask your child to tell you about which Religion and celebration they have been learning about? Also ask them what does diversity mean to them? I hope you will be impressed with the response.

Public Health have lifted the restrictions that we have had. This is due to the significant drop in case numbers. So staff will now no longer wear face masks in communal areas in schools. Parents and Carers there is no need to wear face coverings when dropping off or collecting children. PCR tests are recommended for all adults and pupils if they are a close contact of a positive case. If the test is negative, pupils can return to school, however they must stay at home if they go on to develop symptoms and be retested. A close contact means some one who you share a house with. Assemblies and staff and meetings can be held in person but Governor meetings will still be held virtually. We can now go ahead with Educational visits and residential visits. However if case numbers were to rise again we would need to put further measures in place.

Lates—Please can we ask that all children arrive on time in the morning. Main school the whistle goes at 8.55am and learning starts straight away. Base the doors are opened at 9.05am and again children begin their morning routine immediately. We understand that from time to time things happen and families are late. If this happens to you then children can be brought to the main Reception door. Please make sure you escort your child to the door. Thank you for your support.
