Did you know that it is **National Anger Awareness Week**? This week we have discussed the emotion anger. We have compared anger to a bottle of pop. Covid update - This week we have had further guidance from the Government re safety measures. Staff are encouraged to wear face masks in communal areas in school. PCR tests continue to be recommended for all adults and pupils if they are a close contact of a positive case. If the test is negative, pupils can return to school, however they must stay at home if they go on to develop symptoms and be retested. A close contact means some one who you share a house with. Assemblies, Governor and staff meetings will be held virtually. We can now go ahead with Educational visits and residential visits but each visit will be carefully considered before it is agreed.
