Our reply:
Child abuse is when a child or young person is being harmed or isn't being looked after properly by a parent, carer or family member.

What should I do?



Our reply:
Talk to someone, an adult you trust. This could be a neighbour, relative or professional such as a teacher, school nurse, doctor or police officer.

Our reply:
The person you speak to will listen to you. Depending on what you say they may need to pass it on to someone who has experience of keeping children safe.
