This week we have been talking about British Values. At school we learn about the important values our Government want British Citizens to live by. Those values are Democracy, Rule of Law, Individual Liberty, Tolerance and respect



Being democratic is about fairness and giving everyone the equal right to voice their opinion. It is about team work and listening to others. An example in school is voting for our school council. It is about giving suggestions to our school councillors too.



Rule of law is about ensuring everyone abides by the same laws and no one gets treated differently. An example in school is following our class rules.



Individual Liberty is that we have the freedom and liberty to express what we feel so long as it is within the laws of the country. An example at school is being encouraged to talk about how we feel and using the zones of regulation.



Tolerance and respect is about understanding, listening to and living alongside people who have a different belief, faith and lifestyle to you. At school we learn about people with different faiths, beliefs and lifestyles: we have a multi-faith week and autism awareness week.

Having strong values makes us better people. This week we have been recognising who can demonstrate our British Values in school.

## Cookery Club

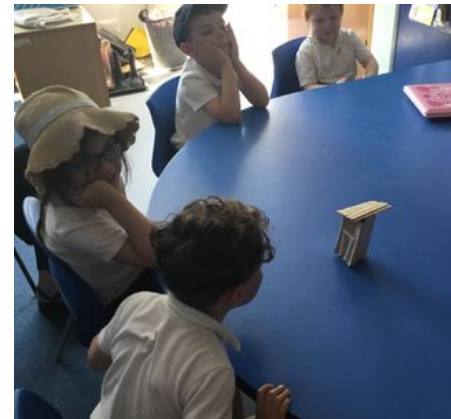
