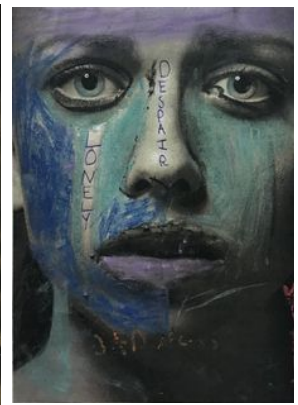

## Art in Blossoms

In our Art and Design topic this half term, Blossoms have been learning all about the art movement Expressionism. We have found out how the artists used strong colours to evoke the emotions of the people featured in the art and really focussed on their facial expressions. Next, we studied the artist Edvard Munch who was prolific in the Expressionist movement as he was one of the first artists to use this style and it was completely different to the muted work that came before it. This week, Blossoms learnt how to add colour and text to photographic backgrounds. We discussed each of the photographs and the emotions each showed before then sharing ideas of the colours and words that could represent those emotions. Then, Blossoms created their amazing art work by adding colour using oil pastels and text using their own media. Brilliant work Blossoms!



## This week in Acorns

In maths we have been sorting coins. We looked at 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p, 20p, 50p, £1 and £2. We were so impressed at how the children were confident to name each coin, and are beginning to understand the value, ordering them from least to most amounts.



In our topic work, we were learning about habitats. We created some small world habitats, made a seascape in the tuff tray, matched animals to their habitats and did some detailed drawings of shells.



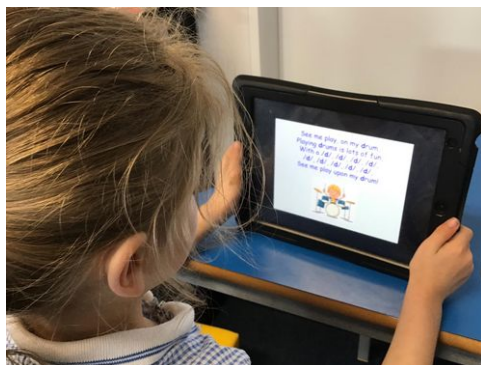
## Maples Fieldwork

This week maples have been out in the local area identifying what we could see as part of our geography fieldwork. We then enjoyed some time at the local park. A lovely morning!



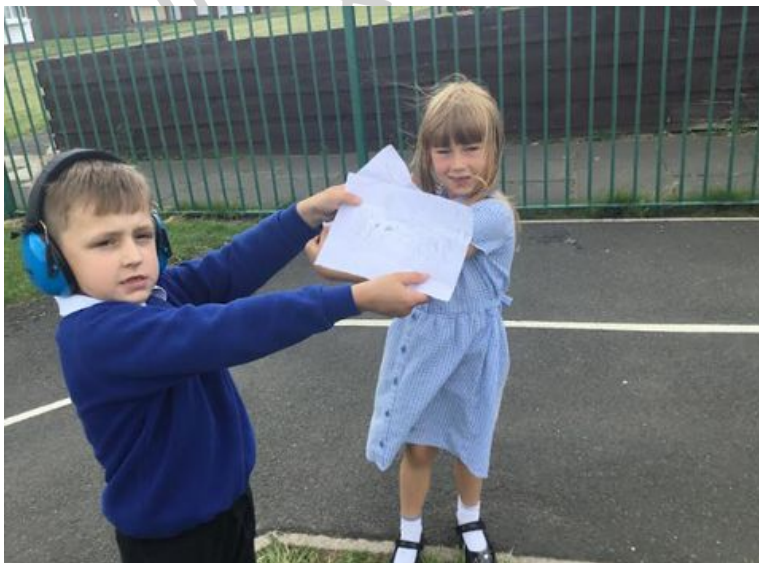
## Super Duper Week In Rowans

**What Parents & Carers Need to Know about RUMBLE**

**WHAT ARE THE RISKS?**

**POLITICAL AFFILIATIONS**  
The company which developed Rumble is often responsible for leading such sites. The site's content is often created and published by Donald Trump, Tucker Carlson and other conservative figures. Rumble is often associated with the far-right and has been used to spread misinformation and hate speech. Many parents may find that such content is inappropriate for their children.

**PROVOCATIVE CONTENT**  
Rumble is often filled with challenging and provocative content, which is often designed to attract attention. This content can be highly inflammatory and may be inappropriate for a young audience.

**INAPPROPRIATE MATERIAL**  
In many cases, Rumble is used to spread content that is inappropriate for a young audience. This content can be highly inflammatory and may be inappropriate for a young audience.

**CONTRVERSIAL FIGURES**  
Many of Rumble's top creators are controversial figures who have previously been banned from other social media platforms. This content can be highly inflammatory and may be inappropriate for a young audience.

**SENSITIVE TOPICS**  
Rumble is often filled with sensitive topics, which can be highly inflammatory and may be inappropriate for a young audience.

**Advice for Parents & Carers**

**TALK ABOUT POLITICS**  
Rumble does have a range of moderators, but the focus of the platform means that some parents may find it difficult to monitor their children's activity. It is important to talk to your child about the risks of using Rumble and to encourage them to report any inappropriate content.

**RESEARCH ALTERNATIVES**  
The video-sharing platform is home to a wide range of potentially harmful content, which may be inappropriate for a young audience. It is important to research alternative platforms that offer a safer environment for your child.

**CHECK UP REGULARLY**  
Like any other video-sharing platform, there is a chance that Rumble might be used to spread inappropriate content for your child. It is important to check up on your child's activity regularly and to encourage them to report any inappropriate content.

**DISCUSS IMPARTIALLY**  
Many prominent Rumble accounts use their political affiliations to promote their views. It is important to discuss these views with your child and to encourage them to think critically about the content they see on the platform.

**Meet Our Expert**  
Dr. Catherine is an expert in online safety and has been a leading voice in the field for many years. She has worked with the government and other organizations to help protect children from online risks.
