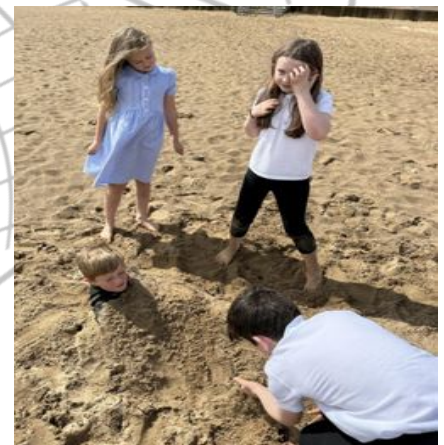
Cookery Club
