Attendance: Get up! Get in! Get on!

In August, new Attendance Legislation was implemented. This is statutory guidance that all schools must follow. It included changes to the amount a parent will pay for a penalty notice fines and some of the register codes were changed.

Maintaining accurate registers are a legal requirement for school staff and why Helen, our Family Support Worker and Attendance Lead, will contact you if we haven't heard why your child is not in school.

We must adhere to the new legislation regarding the registers. This means that we will now need to implement a change to the codes we use. Currently, if your child is more than 10 minutes late to school, they receive an 'L' code (Late) and this will continue but, from Monday 23/9/24, we will also start using a 'U' code (Late, after registers closed). Registers

will close at 9:35am, any children arriving after then (unless they are at a medical appointment or there are exceptional circumstances) will receive a 'U' code. This code affects their overall attendance percentage as it is classified as an 'unauthorised absence'. 10 'U' codes in a 10-week period could result in a penalty notice fine.

This is not something we have implemented lightly; we must do this in order to maintain our statutory duty. We implore you to please inform us if you think there are exceptional circumstances to why your child may arrive at school after 9:35am, but we also ask that you continue to strive to have your child at school on time, every day. We do not want your child to miss any learning.

Please contact Helen if you need this explained further. Thank you for your support.


