Mrs Tones' phrase of the week is 'we need to have courage to make our own choices to achieve our goals'. This week, we looked at how the Atlantic salmon has to be both resilient and determined to achieve its life goal of returning to its place of birth. Bikeability for Year 4:

Yesterday, some of our Year 4 pupils completed their Level 1 Bikeability on our school yard. They all worked very hard and listened carefully to the instructions given. Firstly, the children were taught how to check their bikes were in a safe working order before being used such as checking the air in the tyres. Then, the children learnt a range of skills such as how to move off safely, how to signal and how to swerve if they were to come across something in front of them when on their bikes. They used the track on the yard as well as maneuvering in between cones to practise their skills. The level 1 course prepares the



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children for riding in the community for the next level of Bikeability in Year 5. Great work Year 4. We are all very proud of you.
