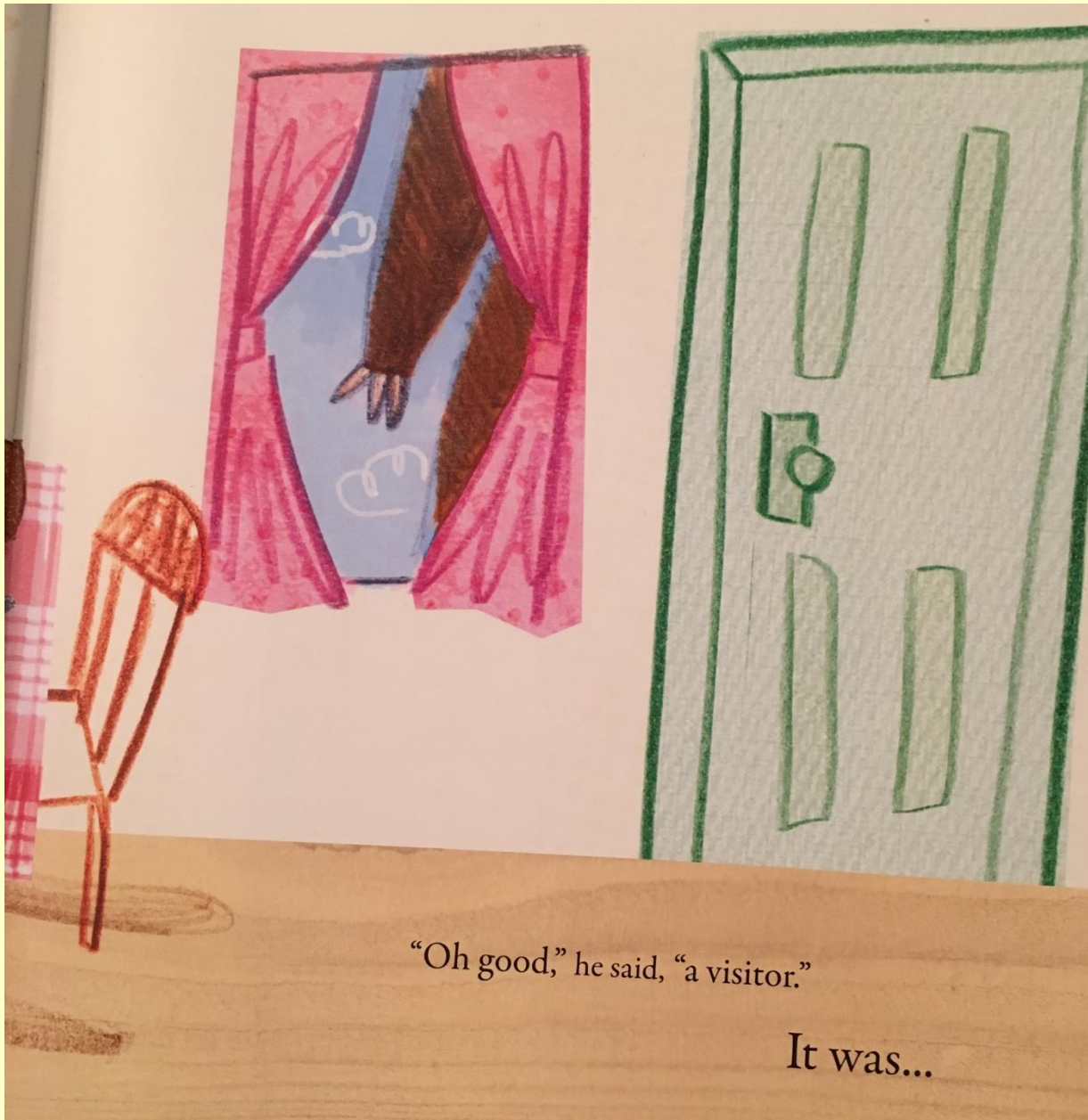
Who do you think it is?
