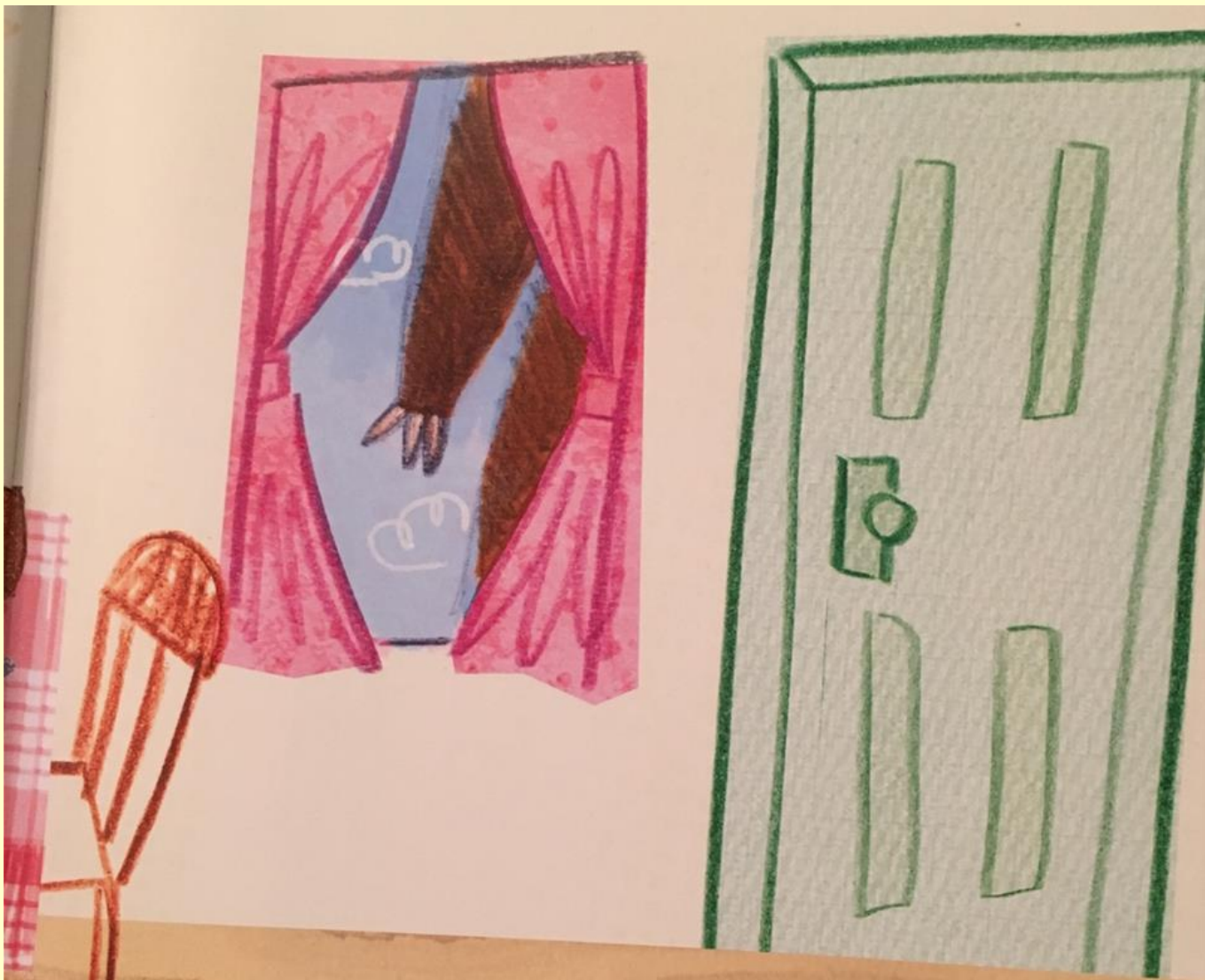


Read the story up to where we
