### Information

#### Uniform

Please make sure all items of uniform are labelled clearly. Remember Wednesday is PE day (for both F1 and F2) and we request children come to school in their PE kit. Children can wear their school jumper or a navy blue PE hoody. PE hoodies can only be worn on a Wednesday.



Please remember to provide your child with a pair of wellies so that they can play in our mud kitchen and water areas and not worry about getting their school shoes muddy. This way we can also keep our indoor areas clean, now we no longer have sandshoes in school. Please send your wellies in to school from 21<sup>st</sup> September.



#### Water

Please ensure that your child has their own labelled water bottle in school with them every day. If your child is packed lunch this needs to be a separate, additional drink.

#### Snack and baking plea

Please could we ask you for a voluntary contribution of 50p a week to enable us to bake and taste a variety of foods with your children. It also helps us to subsidise the children's daily snack. The money box will be available for you to put your contribution in on the playground from next week.

## **COVID-19**

A few parents have asked what measures we have in place to comply with COVID-19 regulations and how school is different. Here are a few examples:

- All children have their own stationary, labelled with their name and coat peg symbol.
- Each child has their own labelled pot of playdough.
- Cleaning is taking place throughout the day.
- Children are in a year group bubble and will not spend time with another bubble.
- Staggered start times to ease congestion on the school site.
- Sand is not in use.
- PE equipment is not shared with other bubbles.
- Children do not get changed on the school site.
- Disposable aprons for painting and messy activities (on order.)
- Any child who is symptomatic will be accompanied with foundation stage staff to our isolation room and their parent/carer will be called immediately.

## Wrap around care

At Christopher Pickering we offer a breakfast club for F2 children from 7:30am in a morning. We also offer an after-school club which runs straight from school, with the last pick up being 5:30pm. Please contact the office to secure your place.

For the first time, we will be offering wrap around care in F1 if there is the demand. We will be gathering interest in the next few weeks.

# Reading

All children will be receiving a reading for pleasure book next week. Due to our current guidelines this must be returned on the given day to ensure the book can be quarantined and cleaned before going home with another family.

# Topic

Our topic this half term is People Who Help Us. We are looking forward to introducing the children to this topic. We will be holding our first 'Wow Day' next Thursday (24<sup>th</sup> September) where the children can come to school dressed as someone who may help them in the community; a doctor, police officer, fire fighter, even a teacher! Please do not to any expense though, homemade costumes are just as fun.
