How do chicks get out of their eggs? Isabella knew that "they crack it".

Facts we learnt about hatching our chickens...

- The incubator is kept at 37.5°C
- The eggs take 21 days to hatch
- The chicks break the shell from the inside with a special lump on their beak. This is called a tooth.
- Chickens lays around 300 eggs per year.



The children promised Grandad Chicken and Henrietta that they would look after her eggs and report back what happens to them. Everyone is very excited to see what happens.
