Human	A person and a mammal. (us)	<p><b>The 5 Senses</b> Humans have five senses. We are made up of different features like hair and legs.</p>

Body	The main part of a person or animal, not including the head, arms, and legs		<p>We have 5 senses - we can see with our eyes, smell with our nose, hear with our ears, taste with our tongue and touch with our hands/feet etc.</p>												
Mammals	Mammals are animals that breathe air, grow hair or fur and feed on their mother's milk as a baby.		<p>Animals are grouped depending on their characteristics such as mammals, birds, fish, reptiles and amphibians.</p>												
Reptiles	All reptiles breathe air. They have scales on their skin		<p>Humans and animals have both similar and different features e.g. Head and body. Fur, scales, horns etc.</p>												
Birds	All birds have a beak, two legs, feathers and wings	<p>Animals eat a range of things, some animals such as wolves are carnivores so they only eat meat, camels are herbivores so they only eat plants and pigs are omnivores which eat meat and plants.</p>													
Fish	Fish live and breathe under water. They have scaly skin, fins to help them swim and they breathe through gills.														
Amphibians	Amphibians live in the water as babies and on land as they grow older. They have smooth, slimy skin														
Carnivores	Animals that only eat meat.														
Herbivores	Animals that only eat plants.														
Omnivores	Animals that eat both meat and plants.														
Sight	Your eyes let you see all the things around you.														
Hearing	Your ears let you listen to all the things around you. Your brain is able to tell what different sounds are														
Taste	Your sense of taste comes from your tongue. You can tell if something tastes bitter or sweet. You might have some tastes you like and some you don't.														
Touch	Your skin gives you the sense of touch. You can tell if something is warm, cold, smooth or rough without even looking at it!
