



F2 Make Wooden
Spoon Puppets

This term, our Design Technology challenge has been to make wooden spoon puppets and explore how we can attach materials together. We decided to link them to our topic of 'Cinderella', which we love!

We thought about what characters we could make and how we would make them. Let's see how we got on...



We talked about how we might fix them together. We could glue things, tie them, twist them with pipe cleaners or use some tape to fix them.



First of all the children decided to glue their eyes onto their wooden spoons. Edison said that it was a bit sticky, but it worked well. They then drew on the rest of the faces (and even some make-up) using felt-tips.



Each character wore either a dress or a cape. Rory found that he was able to twist a pipe cleaner really tightly around the wooden spoon and this held the fabric on really well. Some children wanted to tie theirs on with wool or ribbon but this was a little bit more difficult and they needed more help.



The results were fabulous!
