Everything was mixed ready for us to make our scones.

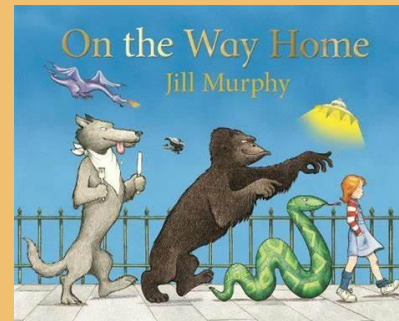


Our bakers were washed and ready.
