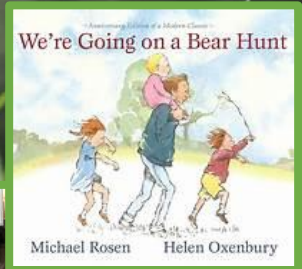
When we looked there was blue and yellow paint in the bag.

We mixed small 'dips' of paint together to create our own 'greens' and tried hard to paint straight lines to make lots of grass.





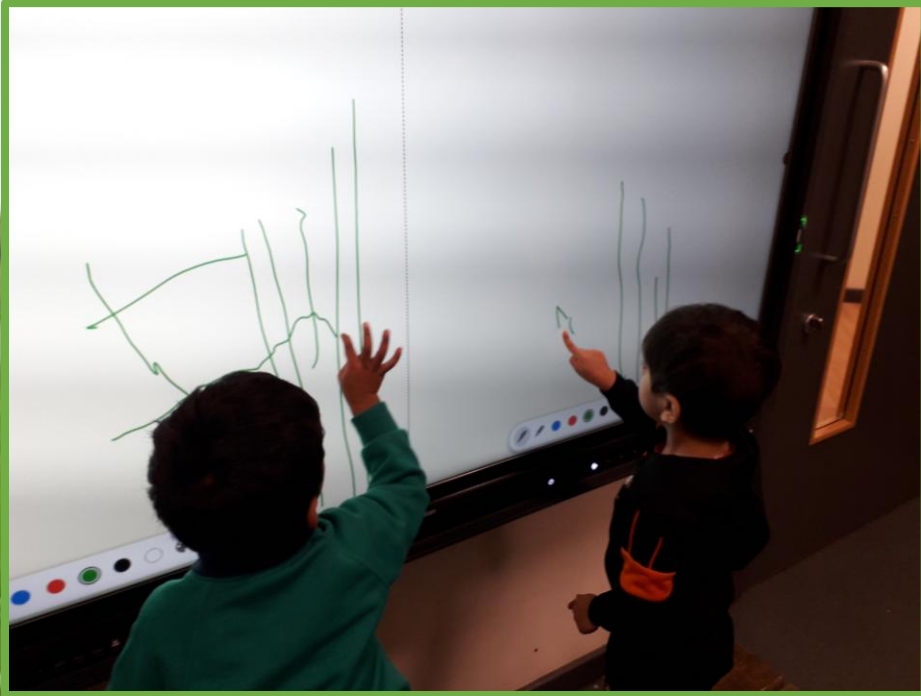
We have done lots of different 'grass' activities though. Autumn used different 'grasses' with our green play-dough.

Some children made paint brushes with Miss Carrick. They made them out of sticks, grass and string. Fancy painting with grass! It was good fun.

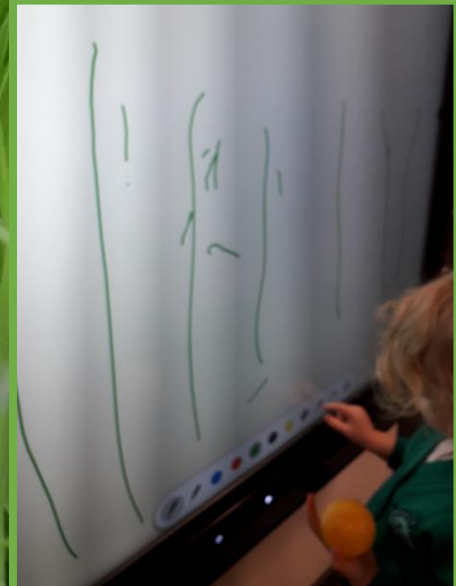
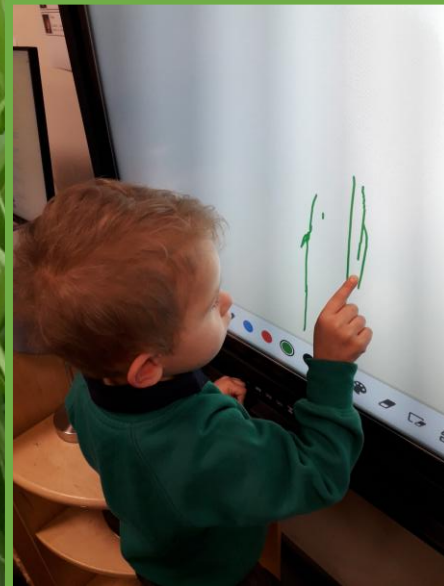
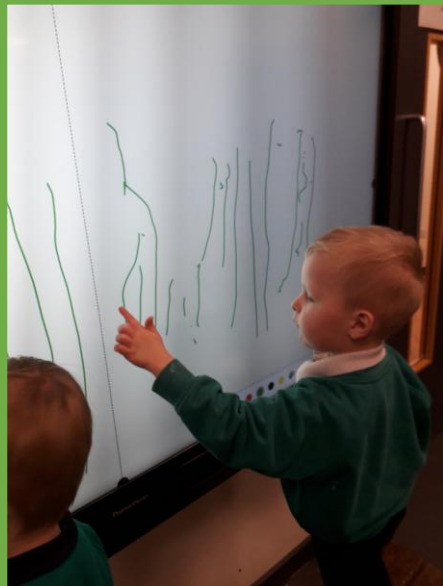


“Look at my brush,” said Elliot.
