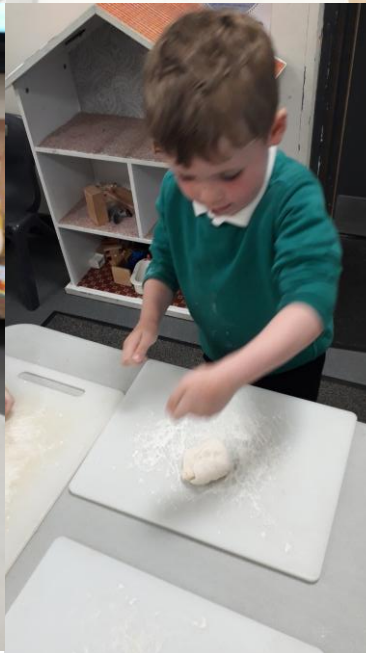
We took in turns mixing the water into the floury mixture.

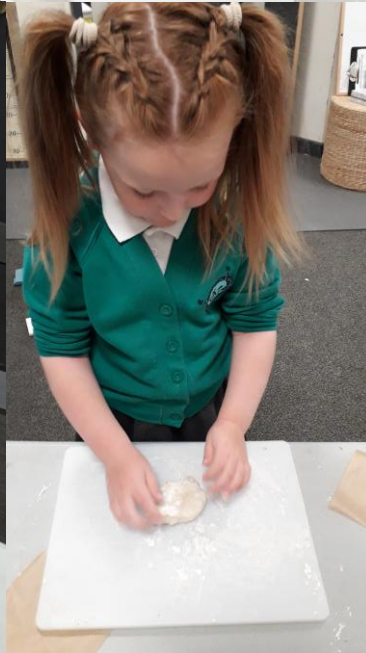
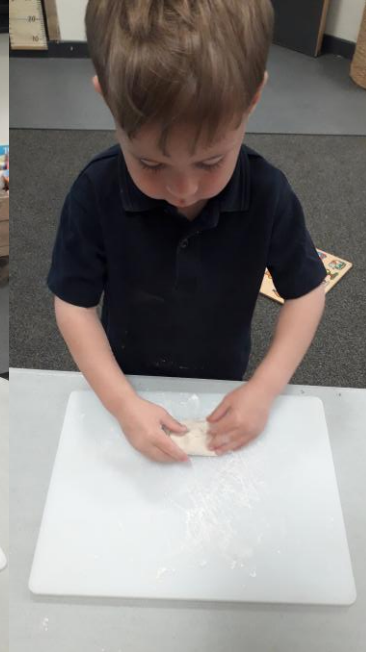
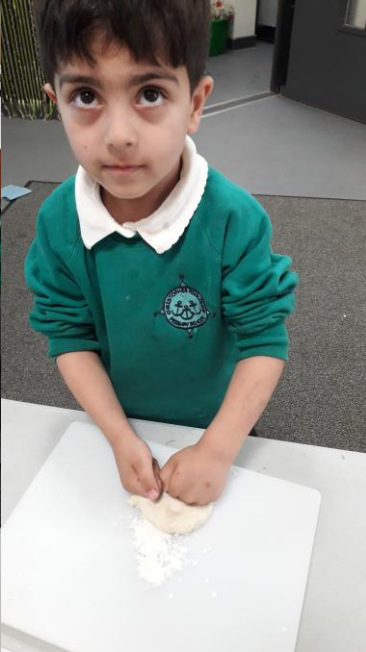
Roman said, "it's getting sticky".
