Elevate Program

Our ambitious Elevate Programme identifies students who have the potential to make greater progress than they are currently. It helps to support students of all abilities through timetabled sessions, small group tutor periods, workshops and 1:1 mentoring. The Elevate Programme identifies students who may benefit from support, additional opportunities, or simply a key member of staff to provide mentoring. It could relate to students who are exceeding their targets, as well as those who have the potential to make greater progress than they are



currently. It could also include students in receipt of the Pupil Permium or those who are 'looked after children'.

To help us identify students who may potentially benefit from this program, it would really help us if you could let us know if your child is part of a special guardianship arrangement for example, if they live with a grandparent or aunt or uncle, or have previously been in foster care. We may also be able to apply for additional funding for these students, which we can use to enhance their education. Any information you provide us will be treated in the strictest confidence.
