

<u>Uniform</u>

Thank you for all your support with uniform. It is really important that students adhere to our published uniform policy, which is available on the website here: <u>courtfields.net/category/information-for-parents</u>. Details were also sent out in the Parent Bulletin at the end of the Summer Term. Our smart uniform helps to promote a pride in the school, which many of you have said is so important for our students. Tutors will be in contact regarding any uniform issues and we thank you for your support in ensuring all students are in the correct uniform each day.

Shoes are a key area, so we have also included pictures on the internet of the correct and incorrect shoes for school. We have made some concessions as regard shoes, as you will see, but we are not able to accept trainers of any sort.

Shoes should be plain black (with black soles) and polishable. They should not be suede or canvas. Boots, heeled shoes, trainers or 'Converse-style' shoes are not acceptable. 'Vans-style' leather shoes are acceptable. In the past we have not allowed students to wear Patent leather shoes, however we have reviewed this due to the growing number of very smart patent shoes available. In line with this, students are now allowed wear plain black patent shoes.

Late to school

The punctuality of the vast majority of our students is excellent, but we do have students who are late to school with no clear reason. Punctuality is a vital life skills and in order to address this effectively we have clarified our processes regarding lates.

If a student is late to school they will be issued with an S1, with an automatic, same-day break detention of 15 minutes. Should they fail to attend, this will be escalated to an S2, 30 minute lunch detention. We have introduced a second bell at 8.40am to signal the official start of Tutor Time. Students must be in their Tutor Base (or other location by prior arrangement) by this bell. If not, they will be marked as late.
